RE: Sale of City of Lexington Property and C&D Site Considerations

## Dear Board:

After further discussion, the City of Lexington (City) offers the following terms in an effort to work towards expansion of landfill capacity to a new site for LASWA membership use:

1.	The City would deed 330 acres of property to LASWA for the construction
	and operation of a new landfill; at a price of per acre, for a total
	of Geological characterization on the land has been completed
	with no abnormalities identified. The analysis would be given to LASWA to
	use in the permitting process; saving an estimated 15-18 months of landfill
	permitting time, and

2. LASWA would sign a ten (10) year service contract to accept City C&D waste to be deposited in the LASWA C&D site at a rate of \$10.00 per ton.

The City maintains its position that it is important for LASWA to complete the following activities prior to landfill expansion to determine financial assurance and operational needs:

- 1. Conduct a third party solid waste flow analysis to determine the current solid waste volume originating in member jurisdictions; including all residential, governmental, commercial, agriculture, and industrial wastes.
- 2. Determine future intent of member jurisdictions (and haulers) to deliver solid waste to LASWA; including the development and execution of new service agreements for ten (10) year increments to guarantee solid waste flow to the facility.

3. Adopt a policy related to necessary cash reserves for future operations, as well as a policy to distribute excess revenue (reserves) to member jurisdictions on a pro rata basis to offset local solid waste collection and recycling activities.

As a member of LASWA, the City has concern that expansion activities are planned in an efficient, effective, and responsible manner to ensure Agency sustainability into the future.
