Pepplitsch gave an update of the Lexington Public Schools' intentions to use South Lincoln Street near Morton Elementary School and noted the city will need to keep an easement for utility lines. Following discussion, moved by Salem, seconded by Tomasek, to suspend the rules regarding the reading of ordinances on three separate occasions. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Bennett, Tomasek, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

Ordinance No. 2269 was read by title. Moved by Salem, seconded by Bennett, to approve Ordinance No. 2269 on final reading. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Bennett, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

LIQUOR LICENSE:

Mayor Fagot opened a public hearing to consider a liquor license application by Aguirre Inc. dba Los Agaves. Dydra Zorrero, a representative of the business, requested Council approval of a Class "I D" liquor license application for the business located at 405 East Pacific, Lexington, NE. She explained that she, her husband and her father-in-law have signed a lease with the owner of the building and plan to open a bar with food items to be added in the future. Pepplitsch reported that no adverse comments have been received on the application. The public hearing was closed. Following discussion, moved by Tomasek, seconded by Salem, to recommend approval of the application as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Bennett, Salem, Tomasek, Fagot. Motion carried.

ANNEXATION:

Mayor Fagot opened a public hearing to consider the annexation of Northwest Third Addition. Pepplitsch noted that this addition is a replat of two subdivisions and an additional 6 acre tract. The 6 acre portion had not been previously included in the corporate limits. There being no further comments, the public hearing was closed. Resolution No. 09-24 was read. Following discussion, moved by Salem, seconded by Bennett to approve Resolution No. 09-24. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Bennett, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

Following discussion, moved by Salem, seconded by Bennett, to approve the plans and specifications for the project and authorize the City Manager to solicit bids. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Bennett, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

SOCCER BUILDING:

Pepplitsch presented plans and specifications for the Soccer Field Building project. Following discussion, moved by Tomasek, seconded by Salem, to approve the plans and specifications for the project and authorize the City Manager to solicit bids. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Bennett, Salem, Tomasek, Fagot. Motion carried.

17th STREET IMP:

Dana Daniels presented plans and specifications of the 17th Street Improvements project. He noted the bid will include alternates for concrete and asphalt. Following discussion, moved by Bennett, seconded by Salem, to approve the plans and specifications for the project and authorize the City Manager to solicit bids. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Salem, Bennett, Fagot. Motion carried.

PAY REQUEST:

Daniels presented Pay Request #1 from Paulsen Inc. for the Dawson County Opportunity Center Phase 1 in the amount of \$23,679.00 and gave an update on the project. Following discussion, moved by Tomasek, seconded by Bennett, to approve the pay request as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Bennett, Tomasek, Fagot. Motion carried.

PAY REQUEST:

Daniels presented Pay Request #1 from Paulsen Inc. for the Legend Oaks Infrastructure Improvements project in the amount of \$104,607.35. Following discussion, moved by Bennett, seconded by Tomasek, to approve the pay request as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Tomasek, Bennett, Fagot. Motion carried.

MEETING DATE:

Due to the absence of several members of the Council at the November 10, 2009, meeting, moved by Tomasek, seconded by Bennett, to schedule the first regular meeting in November to November 9, 2009, 5:30 p.m. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Bennett, Tomasek, Fagot. Motion carried.

ROUNDTABLE:

Pepplitsch gave a reminder of a FEMA public meeting on Wednesday, October 14, 2009 at 10 a.m. at the Courthouse, for preliminary flood plain remapping discussion. He also reported on several future agenda items including agreements pertaining to the Northwest Third Addition. He noted that work on an industrial spec building will begin soon. He noted that a community visit by DED for the Downtown Revitalization grant application will be held at the Public Library on October 19, at 10:30 a.m.

There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Fagot declared the meeting adjourned.
