EECBG AGREEMENT:

Pepplitsch presented a financial aid agreement with the Nebraska Energy Office for an energy efficiency retrofit project at the Dawson County Opportunity Center. He explained that the \$250,000 grant would be for roof repairs and insulation upgrade for the building, the local match being \$102,500 for a total estimated project of \$352,500. Following discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Bennett, to authorize the Mayor and the City Manager to execute necessary documents for the EECBG grant. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Tomasek, Bennett, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION EASEMENT: Council reviewed a request by the Central Platte NRD on a proposed

conservation easement for property within the City's zoning jurisdiction. Following discussion, moved by Salem, seconded by Tomasek, to direct the issue to the Planning Commission for review and comment. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Miller, Bennett, Tomasek, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

STORM WATER AGREEMENT:

Pepplitsch presented a memorandum of understanding with NDOR for illicit discharge detection and elimination activities related to storm water along non-freeway portions of the state highway system within the Lexington jurisdiction. Following discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Tomasek, to authorize the City Manager to execute the required documents for the MOU with NDOR as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Bennett, Tomasek, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Pepplitsch presented the Financial Report for June 2010, noting that 75% of the fiscal year has been completed. Following discussion, moved by Bennett, seconded by Tomasek, to accept the Financial Report as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Miller, Tomasek, Bennett, Fagot. Motion carried.

BUDGET HEARING:

Pepplitsch reviewed a draft budget proposal for Fiscal year 2011. He reviewed the General Fund allocations and the Capital Improvement and Equipment Plans.
