Following discussion, moved by Salem, seconded by Tomasek, to suspend the rules regarding the reading of an ordinance on three separate occasions. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Bennett, Miller, Tomasek, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

Ordinance No. 2312 was presented on final reading. Moved by Miller, seconded by Bennett, to approve Ordinance No. 2312 on final reading. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Tomasek, Bennett, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE: Ordinance No. 2314 entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO ASSESS THE COST OF PROPERTY MAINTENANCE AGAINST CERTAIN PROPERTIES; TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM" was presented on second reading. Following a review of a concern raised during the first reading, moved by Miller, seconded by Salem, to suspend the rules regarding the reading of an ordinance on three separate occasions. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Bennett, Tomasek, Salem, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.

Ordinance No. 2314 was presented on final reading. Moved by Salem, seconded by Bennett, to approve Ordinance No. 2314 on final reading. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Miller, Tomasek, Bennett, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

- **STREET CLOSING REQUEST:** Mike Lonowski requested temporary street closures to hold a car show/fundraising event on Sunday, May 27, 2012. He outlined the event and planned activities. Following discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Tomasek, to authorize street closures for the event and direct staff to coordinate such closures with the event organizer. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Bennett, Salem, Tomasek, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.
- **ONE & SIX YEAR STREET IMPROVEMENT PLAN:** Pepplitsch reviewed a draft of the 2012 1&6 Year Street Improvement Plan. He noted that the draft plan will also go to the Planning Commission for review and comment. Following discussion, Pepplitsch noted that a public hearing will be scheduled on the final plan for March 13, 2012; no action was taken.
- AIRPORT ROAD PROJECT: Pepplitsch requested Council approval of plans and specifications for the Airport Road Paving project. Following a review of the project by Dana Daniels, moved by Miller, seconded by Tomasek, to approve the plans and specifications for the Airport Road Paving project and to authorize the City Manager to solicit bids. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Bennett, Salem, Tomasek, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.
- APPOINTMENTS: Pepplitsch discussed the appointment of individuals to the newly created Community Development Agency. Following discussion regarding Council member representation, Pepplitsch proposed the following appointments:

Jason Fagot – 5 year term; Gail Hall – 4 year term; Jeff Wightman – 4 year term; Steve Smith – 3 year term; Steve Atwood – 3 year term; John Fagot – 2 year term; Linda Miller – 1 year term.

Moved by Salem, seconded by Bennett, to approve appointments to the Community Development Agency as proposed. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Miller, Tomasek, Bennett, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Pepplitsch reviewed a financial report for January 2012. Following discussion, moved by Tomasek, seconded by Salem, to accept the financial report as

presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Miller, Bennett, Salem, Tomasek,
Fagot. Motion carried.ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION:Pepplitsch asked Council to consider dates for a work session in March. More
information will be forwarded to Council and Staff.Berke noted that she will be attending Clerk School in Kearney, March 12-16,
2012.ADJOURNMENT:There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Fagot
