PUBLIC HEARING:

Mayor Fagot opened a public hearing for Council to consider a rezoning application by Todd Booth for property located at 311 East 4th, Street, from C-3 Highway Commercial to C-2 Core Commercial. The change in zoning would allow for a single dwelling unit on the second level of the building on that property. Booth noted that the residence would be used for incoming employees as temporary housing. Pepplitsch noted that the Planning Commission has reviewed the application and recommends Council approval. There being no public comments, the public hearing was closed. Following discussion, Ordinance No. 2315 entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO REZONE LOTS 14-18, BLOCK 61, ORIGINAL TOWN OF LEXINGTON, FROM C-3 HIGHWAY COMMERCIAL DISTRICT TO C-2 CORE COMMERCIAL DISTRICT; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OR SECTIONS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM" was presented. Moved by Salem, seconded by Miller, to suspend the rules regarding the reading of an ordinance on three separate occasions. Roll call. Voting "ave" were Bennett, Tomasek, Miller, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

Ordinance No. 2315 was presented on Final reading. Moved by Salem, seconded by Tomasek, to approve Ordinance No. 2315 on Final reading. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Miller, Bennett, Tomasek, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

ONE & SIX YEAR STREET **IMPROVEMENT PLAN:**

Mayor Fagot opened a Public Hearing to consider the One & Six Year Street Improvement Plan. Pepplitsch reviewed the plan, noting the Planning Commission had recommended approval of the document. Following the overview and no public comments, the public hearing was closed. Resolution No. 2012-04 was presented. Moved by Miller, seconded by Bennett, to approve Resolution No. 2012-04 as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Tomasek, Bennett, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.
