FINANCIAL REPORT: Moved by Vivas, seconded by Salem, to accept the financial report for August 2015 as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Miller, Roberts, Salem, Vivas, Fagot. Motion carried.

NON-CONFORMING USE: Mayor Fagot open a public hearing to consider an application to change a non-conforming use to another non-conforming use on the property located at 502 East 6th Street. Terry Jorgensen appeared to explain his intentions of using the buildings on the property for vehicle and personal storage, as opposed to the current plumbing contractor business. Discussion included prohibition of outside storage and compliance with minimal landscaping and other code requirements. It was noted the Planning Commission had reviewed the application and recommended approval with specific conditions as deemed appropriate. The public hearing was closed. Following discussion, moved by Salem, seconded by Miller, to approve the application for the change in a non-conforming use, with prohibition of outdoor storage and compliance with code requirements including landscaping. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Vivas, Roberts, Miller, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

LIQUOR LICENSE: Mayor Fagot opened a public hearing to consider a liquor license application by Los Arcos, LLC dba Los Arcos Mexican Restaurant. Gerardo Vazquez, along with his attorney Jesus Tena, outlined his plans to serve alcoholic beverages in connection with the restaurant operation. Following discussion, the public hearing was closed. Moved by Vivas, seconded by Salem, to recommend approval of the liquor license application. Voting "aye" were Miller, Roberts, Salem, Vivas, Fagot. Motion carried.

DAD ANNUAL REPORT: Jen Wolf presented a 2014-2015 annual report for Dawson Area Development operations. Following discussion, no action was taken.

PAY REQUEST: Pepplitsch reviewed Pay Request #3 from TL Sund Constructors for the Lexington Fieldhouse project in the amount of \$80,531.75. Following discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Salem, to approve the pay request as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Vivas, Roberts, Salem, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.

PAY REQUEST: Pepplitsch reviewed Pay Request #4 from TL Sund Constructors for the WWTP Support Facility project in the amount of \$66,301.50. Following discussion, moved by Roberts, seconded by Vivas, to approve the pay request as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Miller, Salem, Vivas, Roberts, Fagot. Motion carried.

PAVING PROJECT: Pepplitsch reviewed bids received for the 2015 Opportunity Center South Paving Improvements project. One bid was received from TL Sund Constructors for \$132,503.50, which was 16% under the engineer's estimate. Following discussion, moved by Salem, seconded by Vivas, to accept the bid, award a contract to TL Sund Constructors for the project, and authorize the execution of necessary documents. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Miller, Roberts, Vivas, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

WORK SESSION: Moved by Miller, seconded by Vivas, to schedule a council work session for Saturday, October 10, 2015, at 8:00 a.m. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Roberts, Vivas, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.

ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION: Pepplitsch gave an update on current projects.

ADJOURNMENT: There being no further business to come before the Council, Fagot declared the meeting adjourned.
