A Regular Meeting of the Lexington City Council was held Tuesday, January 12, 2016, at the Lexington City Hall, 406 E. 7th Street, Lexington, Nebraska at 5:30 p.m. Members of the Council present were John Fagot, John Salem, Linda Miller, Dora Vivas, and Jeremy Roberts. City Officials present were City Manager Joe Pepplitsch, Assistant City Manager Dennis Burnside, City Attorney Brian Copley, Finance Director Barb Hodges, Police Chief Tracy Wolf and City Clerk Pamela Baruth. INTENT RESOLUTION: Resolution No. 2016-01 was presented. Pepplitsch reviewed the resolution. Following discussion, moved by Salem, seconded by Miller, to approve Resolution No. 2016-01. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Vivas, Robert, Miller, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO. 2016-01

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, as follows:

- Section 1. The Mayor and City Council (the "Council") of the City of Lexington, Nebraska ("City") hereby find and determine that it is necessary and appropriate to declare an official intent to issue tax-exempt bond anticipation notes or bonds by the City to provide funds and, in addition, the City's reasonable expectations to reimburse certain expenditures with the proceeds of such bond anticipation notes or bonds as proposed to be issued by the City in connection with the construction of certain highway and street improvements and other related appurtenant improvements now being or to be constructed in the City.
- Section 2. This resolution shall stand as a statement of the official intent of the City under Regulation Section 1.150-2 and for such purpose the following information is hereby given:
- 1. A general functional description of the project for which expenditures may be made and reimbursement with bond anticipation notes or bond proceeds may be taken is: construction of concrete or asphalt streets, grading, curbing and drainage improvements, and other related improvements including sub-grade preparation, paving replacement, and other necessary and appurtenant improvements, the cost of which improvements is estimated to total \$1,000,000 for project costs for Northwest Third Addition Phase II Improvements, 2016 Asphalt Overlay Improvements, and Frontier Street Paving projects.
- 2. The principal amount of general obligation notes or bonds expected to be issued by the City for that portion of improvements pertaining to this reimbursement resolution is estimated to be \$1,000,000, which amount represents the expected funds to be advanced by the City for project costs to be reimbursed by the issuance of tax-exempt bond anticipation notes or tax-exempt bonds.

PASSED AND APPROVED this 12th day of January, 2016.

PAY REQUEST: Pepplitsch reviewed Pay Request #7 for the Lexington Fieldhouse project from TL Sund Constructors in the amount of \$6,519.45. Following discussion, moved by Vivas, seconded by Roberts, to approve the pay request as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Miller, Salem, Vivas, Roberts, Fagot. Motion carried.

PAY REQUEST: Pepplitsch reviewed Pay Request #8 for the WWTP Support Facility from TL Sund Constructors in the amount of \$31,270.86. Following discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Salem, to approve the pay request as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Vivas, Roberts, Salem, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.

LAKE PROJECT: Pepplitsch presented close out documents for the Plum Creek Lake Restoration project which include Change Order #2, Pay Request #3-Final in the amount of \$124,746.25, and the Certification of Completion. Following discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Vivas, to approve all documents as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Roberts, Vivas, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.

WORK SESSION: Moved by Salem, seconded by Vivas, to schedule a work session Saturday, January 30, 2016 at 8:00 a.m. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Miller, Roberts, Vivas, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION: Baruth reminded Council members of the February 1 filing date for incumbents intending to run in the 2016 election. She also stated she will be making reservations for the League of Nebraska Municipalities Mid-Winter Conference. Salem mentioned a positive article in NebraskaLand magazine on Lexington, and encouraged people to read the article if they have not.

ADJOURNMENT: There being no further business to come before the Council, Fagot declared the meeting adjourned.
