CITY HALL LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA

The Mayor and Council of the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, met in regular special session in the City Hall at 8 o'clock P. M., on Second day of July, 1940 Mayor Battle presided and W. R. Egenberger City Clerk recorded the proceedings of this meeting.

The Mayor instructed the Clerk to call the roll. The Clerk called the roll and the following Councilmen were present: Morgan, Power, Seaman, Stewart, Haworth and Britton

Absent: None

Whereupon the Mayor announced that the introduction of ordinances was now in order, and the matter now coming before the Mayor and Council was the passage and approval of Ordinance No. 361 of the City of Lexington, Nebraska.

This ordinance was introduced by Councilman Stewart and is in words and figures as follows, to wit:

Annual Levy Ordinance ORDINANCE NO. 361

An ordinance making a levy for taxation on all the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, for the fiscal year 1940, commencing on the first Tuesday in May 1940.

BE IT ORDIANED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA.

Section 1. That there is hereby levied on all the taxable property within the corporate City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, for the fiscal year 1940, the following.
