


RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, recognizes the importance of planned, orderly, and progressive growth of the City of Lexington to improve the quality of life for all citizens, and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that controlled and planned industrial development is one means to insure the desired progressive growth of the community.

BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council acknowledges the policy that the City of Lexington should have controlled and planned industrial development in the Greater Lexington Area. Such development, however, must be accomplished in such a manner as to continue to improve the quality of life for all citizens. Such development must not be on such a fast pace or to such an extent as to create new problems such as pollution, gettoism, or congestion, all of which are now in evidence in many cities in the east and the west of our nation.
