OPENING

Lexington, Nebraska.
Sept. 24, 1935, 19

The Mayor and Council of the City of Lexington Dawson County, Nebraska, met in ~~regular~~ (special) session in the City Hall at 8:00 o'clock P. M. Mayor Battle presided. City Clerk Olsson recorded the proceedings of this meeting.

ROLL CALL

The Mayor instructed the Clerk to call the roll. The Clerk called the roll and the following Councilmen were present: Malone, Morganson, Hagadone, Spies, Kjar and Gillan.

Absent: none.

ORDER OF BUSINESS

Whereupon the Mayor announced that the introduction of ordinances was now in order.

ORDINANCE NO. 308

Introduction of Ordinance No. 308 of the City of Lexington, Nebraska.

And the matter now coming before the Mayor and Council was the passage and approval of Ordinance No. 308 of the City of Lexington, Nebraska. This ordinance was introduced by Councilman Spies, and is in words and figures as follows, to-wit:

ORDINANCE NO. 308

An ordinance describing property of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, acquired by gift and by purchase at tax sale foreclosure, to be sold by said City, and fixing the time, place and terms of sale.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That Lots Five (5) and Six (6) in Block Thirty (30), MacColl and Leflang's Second Addition to the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, which lots were acquired by gift on May 28, 1921 and May 25, 1921, respectively, for an undetermined purpose, has been abandoned for such purpose or for any purpose, and a sale is deemed expedient for an amount not less than \$500.00, and said lots shall be considered and sold as one tract.

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Section 2. That the East Sixty (E 60) Feet of Lots Four (4), Five (5) and Six (6) in Block "O" in MacColl and Leflang's Addition to the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, which was acquired by purchase at tax sale foreclosure to protect the city's lien thereon, has been abandoned for any use or purpose by said city, and a sale is deemed expedient for an amount not less than \$600.00, and said lots shall be considered and sold as one tract.

Section 3. That a sale of all of the above described property has been authorized by a three-fifths vote of the electors of the City of Lexington at a special election held in said city on August 30, 1932.

Section 4. That Lot Seven (7) in Block "N" in MacColl and Leflang's Addition to Plum Creek, now City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, which was acquired by purchase at tax sale foreclosure on June 10, 1935, to protect the city's lien thereon, has been abandoned for any use or purpose by said city, and a sale of said property is deemed expedient for an amount not less than \$500.00, and said lot shall be considered and sold as one tract.

Section 5. That all of said above described property shall be sold in separate tracts to the highest bidder for cash at a sale to be held at eight o'clock P.M. on the 5th day of November, 1935, at the Council Room in the City Hall in Lexington, Nebraska. Sealed bids only will be accepted, and all bids shall be on file with the City Clerk not later than eight o'clock P.M., November 5, 1935. Each bid on each tract shall be accompanied by certified check for \$100.00 payable to the City of Lexington; and the Mayor and Council shall reserve the right to reject any and all bids.

Section 6. The City Clerk of said City is hereby authorized and directed to give notice of such sale by publication for one week in the Lexington Clipper, a legal weekly newspaper printed and published in Lexington, Nebraska.
