ORDINANCE NO. 310

Introduction of Ordinance No. 310 of the City of Lexington , Nebraska.

And the matter now coming before the Mayor and Council was the passage and approval of Ordinance No. 310 of the City of Lexington, Nebraska. This ordinance was introduced by Councilman Spies, and is in words and figures as follows, to-wit:

ORDINANCE NO. 310

An Ordinance describing property of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, acquired at tax sale foreclosure, providing for the sale thereof and fixing the time, place, terms and manner of sale.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That a sale is deemed expedient of the following described real estate which was acquired by the City of Lexington through tax sale foreclosure proceedings, to-wit:

The East Sixty Feet (E 60') of Lots Four (4), Five (5) and Six (6) in Block "O" in MacColl and Leflang's Addition to the Town of Plum Creek, now City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska.

Lot Seven (7) in Block "N" in MacColl and Leflang's Addition to the Town of Plum Creek, now City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska.

Sealed bids only will be accepted, and all bids shall be on file with the City Clerk not later than eight o'clock P. M. on April 8, 1936. Each bid on each separate tract shall be accompanied by certified check for One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) payable to the City of Lexington, which check shall be forfeited to said City if the successful bidder fails to complete his bid. And the Mayor and Council shall reserve the right to reject any and all bids and to waive any and all irregularities.

Section 3. The City Clerk of said City is hereby directed to give notice of such sale by publication for one consecutive week in the <u>Dawson County Pioneer</u>, a legal weekly newspaper printed and published in Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, which notice shall set out the time, place, terms, manner of sale, legal description and right to reject any and all bids.
