## CITY HALL LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA

The Mayor and Council of the City of Lexington, Dawson met in regular special session in the City Hall at 8:00 o'clock P. M., on Mayor Kjar presided and City Clerk Olsson recorded

the proceedings of this meeting.

The Mayor instructed the Clerk to call the roll. The Clerk called the roll and the following Councilmen were present: Councilmen Gillan, Power, Seaman, Morgan, Barrett, Stewart.

Absent: none.

Whereupon the Mayor announced that the introduction of ordinances was now in order, and the matter now coming before the Mayor and Council was the passage and approval of Ordinance No. 354 of the City of Lexington, Nebraska.

This ordinance was introduced by Councilman Stewart and is in words and figures as follows, to wit:

## ORDINANCE NO. 354

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING AN OCCUPATION TAX UPON BOWLING ALLEYS AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE COLLECTION THEREOF, AND TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That there is hereby levied an occupation tax upon the business of conducting Bowling Alleys within the corporate limits of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, in the sum of \$150.00 per annum or fraction thereof, for the first alley in each and every Bowling Alley, and the sum of \$5.00 per annum or fraction thereof, for each additional alley in any one place of business.

Section 2. Said occupation tax shall be paid to the City Treasurer of such City on or before the first day of May, or at the time of making original application, and license to operate such Bowling Alley shall not be granted until such occupation tax is paid. Such occupation tax and any license granted by the Mayor and Council of said City for the operation of Bowling Alleys shall expire on the first day of May following the date on which such license is issued.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
