

ORDINANCE NO. 578

An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 436, of the City of Lexington, amending Section 4, Article I of Chapter 2 of the Municipal Code of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, governing the hours and time when alcoholic liquor, including beer, may be sold within the said city.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. Section 4 of Article I of Chapter 2 of the Municipal Code of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, as amended by Ordinance No. 436 of said city, is hereby amended to read as follows:


"Section 4. ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR, SALE OF PROHIBITED WHEN; HOURS WHEN SAME MAY BE SOLD--No person shall, within said city, sell at retail any alcoholic liquor, including beer, on the day of any national, state, county or municipal election, including primary election, during the hours the polls are open in said city. No Person shall, within said city, sell at retail any alcoholic liquor, including beer, on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell alcoholic liquor, including beer, within said city on secular days during the months of October to the following May, inclusive, of each year, between the hours of 10:00 P.M. and 6:00 A.M. Provided, however, that on Saturday during such months, such liquors, including beer, may be sold until the hour of 11:00 P.M. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell alcoholic liquor, including beer, within said city on secular days during the months of June to September, inclusive in each year, between the hours of 11:00 P.M. to 6:00 A.M. Provided, however, that on Saturday during the months of June to September, inclusive, such liquors, including beer, may be sold until the hour of 12:00 midnight."

Section 2. That Ordinance No. 436 of the City of Lexington, which was passed and approved the 6th day of May, 1947, is hereby repealed.
