

ORDINANCE NO. 676

AN ORDINANCE CREATING AND NAMING A STREET BEGINNING ON WASHINGTON STREET SOUTH OF WALNUT STREET AND RUNNING THENCE TO BRIDGE STREET TO A POINT NORTH OF ASH STREET IN THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, DAWSON COUNTY, NEBRASKA.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL AND THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA.

Section 1. That the following described real estate is created and declared to be a street in Lexington, Nebraska, and is named Washington Boulevard:

Forty feet (40') Right and left at Right angles to the below described center line.
Commencing at a point on the center line of South Washington Street which is 98.1 Feet South of the Center line of Walnut Street; thence South-Easterly on a 572.96 foot radius curve to the left (initial tangent of which makes an angle of $29^{\circ} 36'$ left with the East line of South Washington Street); a distance of 419.9 Feet; thence Southeasterly at an angle of $29^{\circ} 36'$ left with the East line of South Washington Street a distance of 355.9 Feet; thence South-Easterly on a 763.94 foot radius curve to the right (initial tangent of which the West line of Bridge Street makes an angle of $24^{\circ} 36' 20''$ right) a distance of 560.2 feet to a point on the center line of Bridge Street which is 46.6 feet North of the center line of Ash Street. The northern and southern extremities of said street are to be marked by a $3/4''$ iron pin imbeded in the pavement.

Section 2. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
