> Moved by Councilperson Wightman, seconded by Anderson to change the time of the regular meeting held February 11, 1992 from 7:30 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. Roll call. Voting "aye" were VerMaas, Weeder, Anderson Wightman, and Hawks. Motion carried.

VACATE PROPERTY City Manager Podraza addressed the City Council **GREATER LEXINGTON** stating that Wendy's and Amigo's had constructed signs in the City's right-of-way in the Greater Lexington ADDITION: Addition with what had been interpreted with the blessing of the State of Nebraska. However, it later turned out that the State through an agreement with the City of Lexington objected to the signs and ordered them to be removed. Mr. Mike Toukan and Dick Carpenter representing Wendv's and Amiao's respectedly confirmed the narrative of events as depicted by the City Manager to be true and correct. They further stated considerable money had been expended by their firms to install these signs and wish not to have to remove them.

Mr. Dana Daniels representing Miller & Associates stated that the vacating of this right-of-way and the reversion of the property to the previous owners would require those owners to give the City of Lexington an easement for water mains in that area. No further comments.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE A PORTION OF FRONTAGE STREET RIGHT-OF-WAY; TO PROVIDE FOR REVERSION OF THE VACATED STREET TO ADJOINING PROPERTY OWNERS; TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM" was read before the Council. Moved by Wightman, seconded by Anderson that said Ordinance be passed on first creading. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Weeder, VerMaas, Anderson, Wightman, and Hawks. Motion carried.

POWER BAY City Manager Podraza introduced a Agreement between The City of Lexington and Nebraska Public Power District AGREEMENT: for an additional bay out of the Westminster Substation resulting in a third feed into Lexington. Upon reviewing the costs and the matters substantiating a like cost for Public Power for the same service Dawson Councilperson Wightman moved that the Mayor be authorized to enter into an agreement with Nebraska Public Power District for the construction of a second bay in the Westminster Sub for The City of Lexington, seconded by Weeder. Roll call. Voting "ave" were VerMaas, Anderson, Weeder, Wightman, and Hawks. Motion carried.

D.E.C. GRANT HEARING: City Manager Podraza presented an outline containing costs to purchase a composting machine for use by the City of Lexington. City Manager Podraza explained that the current compost pile was located on a triangular piece of ground East of the Lexington Livestock yards, with the compost being stirred by the use of a front end loader. This machine would allow the City to become more efficient when performing this operation plus the ability of mixing sludge from the disposal plant with the grass and leaves. He further stated that the end product could be sold or given away to fertilize agricultural ground . In summary Mr. Podraza presented an outline of the total cost of the project the amount covered by the grant and the in kind contribution by the City.

Moved by Councilperson Anderson, seconded by VerMaas that the City Administration be allowed to apply for a grant to purchase a composting machine. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Wightman, Weeder, VerMaas, Anderson, and Hawks. Motion carried.

- MANAGER PIZZA HUT: The City Council considered the application of Steven D. Schwartzkopf as Manager of Pizza Hut of America Inc. dba Pizza Hut 701 South Bridge Street, Lexington, Dawson County, License #A2022. Hearing no objections to this request, Councilperson Wightman moved that the application for Steven D. Schwartzkopf for a manager's license at the Pizza Hut 701 South Bridge Street, Lexington be approved. Seconded by VerMaas Roll call. Voting "aye" were Weeder, Anderson, VerMaas, Wightman and Hawks. Motion carried.
- ASSESSMENT APPEAL: City Manager Podraza explained that an assessment district had been formed to construct a sanitary sewer line abutting the Beans property. This district had been formed and advertised during a period of time when the family was having a crisis which accounted for them not requesting a deferral during the allotted time. The City Manager further stated that this property is just north of Sav-A-Lot Food Store is agricultural in nature which qualifies it for the exemption and requested the collection of the assessment should be deferred as provided by statute.

Mr. Kenneth Beans then addressed the Council requesting the deferral of the assessment and interest until the property develops. Upon conclusion of the discussion Councilperson Wightman moved that the City Attorney prepare a resolution deferring the payment of assessment principal for Mr. Kenneth Beans seconded by Weeder. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Anderson, VerMaas, Weeder, Wightman and Hawks. Motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING City Manager Podraza addressed the Lexington City **LAND PURCHASE**: Council stating that City Administration has mentioned previously that in the near future there will no longer be spaces for sale at Greenwood Cemetery. The City Manager then introduced a report from Miller and Associates stating that there is approximately 11.6 acres remaining in Evergreen Cemetery resulting in approximately 4,275 individual lots. The possibility of purchasing ground East of Greenwood Cemetery in the amount of 12.2 acres yielding approximately 3,725 lots.

The discussion which followed pertained to the feasibility of Evergreen Cemetery becoming a Cemetery of choice rather than Greenwood.

During the discussion Mr. Dana Daniels representing Miller and Associates, presented maps and cost estimates for the opening of the 12 acres East of Greenwood compared to the development needed in Evergreen Cemetery. Mr. Daniels stated that without the real estate purchase the earth work, road gravel, sprinkler systems, tree location, fencing, soil preparation, the cost for development at Greenwood Cemetery would be \$64,800.00. As for Evergreen Cemetery the installation of a water well, road gravel, tree relocation, and fencing would amount to \$27,800.00. The City Manager then related to the City Council that he had made some offer for the purchase of real estate east of Greenwood Cemetery, however, he felt the price was to high.

Mrs. Betty Stuckey addressed the Lexington City Council stating that the number of lots per acre being sold at the current price would result in a net profit to the City if the City were to purchase that land at their asking price. Mr. Daniels re-addressed the Council referring to the map at Evergreen Cemetery stating that there is a problem on the northeast corner of the proposed property as a telephone line runs under that property and that there may be some liability with closing the existing slough on the east side of the property.

Upon the conclusion of the discussion, Vice-President Wightman declared the Public Hearing closed. Additional discussion at this time included a problem that could be caused and the agencies that would need to be contacted to fill the slough on the east edge of this ground and the cost involved.

At this time Vice-President Wightman moved that the City Administration be directed to take steps towards the purchase of additional land for Greenwood Cemetery. Hearing no second to the motion at this time, further discussion pertained to the possibility of purchasing two tiers of lots to the east and developing a part at one time rather than purchasing the entire acreage. Additionally bequest funds were discussed. At this time Councilperson Anderson stated that if evaluation of the drainage was included in Vice-President Wightman's motion she could accept the motion. At that time Vice-President Wightman withdrew his previous motion and moved that City Administration be directed to proceed towards evaluating the drainage and purchase of additional land for Greenwood Cemetery, seconded by Anderson. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: VerMaas, Weeder, Anderson, and Wightman. Motion carried.

OVERNIGHT City Manager Podraza informed the Lexington City CAMPERS: Council that this had been discussed at a previous meeting and an ordinance is therefore presented for there consideration at tonights meeting.

> The City Manager further stated that this ordinance would only grant him the authority to allow camping in a park when an activity or when camping is associated with and activity in the park or elsewhere within the City.

> Councilperson VerMaas stated that there has been some objection to the passage of this Ordinance by residents surrounding the park.

> An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO PERMIT TEMPORARY PARKING OF CAMPER TRAILERS IN CITY PARKS; TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM" was read

before the Council. Moved by Councilperson Anderson, seconded by Weeder that said ordinance be passed on first reading. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Wightman, Weeder, and Anderson. Voting "nay" was: VerMaas. Motion carried.

- **PAY ESTIMATE**: The Lexington City Council considered Pay Estimate No. 20 from Paulsen Building and Supply for construction of the Waste Water Treatment Plant. The City Manager addressed the City Council stating that the construction has proceeded along at the same rate as the pay estimate and was recommending payment. Moved by Councilperson Weeder, seconded by Anderson to approved Pay Estimate No. 20 from Paulsen Building and Supply for the Waste Water Treatment Plant in the amount of \$43,460.98. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: VerMaas, Anderson, Weeder, and Wightman. Motion carried.
- O'DONNELL SUBDIVISION: The Lexington City Council reviewed the Subdivision Agreement for O'Donnell's Subdivision on Taft Street North of 13th Street. Mr. Jim O'Donnell addressed the Lexington City Council stating that all items in the agreement were in acceptance to him except for Item 3B, he is wishing that the City would delete the words in addition to and substitute including and where it says right-of-way on Taft Street if the statement could say right-of-way from the center of Taft Street.

Upon conclusion of the discussion, moved by Councilperson Anderson, seconded by Weeder to the accept the Subdivision Agreement for O'Donnell Subdivision. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: VerMaas, Weeder, Anderson, and Wightman. Motion carried.

Moved by Councilperson Weeder, seconded by VerMaas that the following Resolution be passed and approved. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Anderson, VerMaas, Weeder, and Wightman.
