Also present was: Bob Blankenship representing Miller and Associates, Jeff Konen, John Hines, Jim Lauby, Tony Casilla and Derrick Mitchell. The meeting was called to order by Mayor John Wightman.

EXTENSION OF SPECIAL USE PERMIT:

Mr. Derrick Mitchel, representing Stephen Potter, addressed the Lexington City Council stating that Mr. Potter would like to withdraw his request for a special use permit for his property at 909 N. Grant. Additional discussion pertained to this item related to the condition of the building and the possibility of the city condemning that building as a public health hazard. At this time, it was moved by Fagot, seconded by Hawks to withdraw the special use

permit granted to Stephen Potter for a house at 909 N. Grant. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Anderson, Hawks, Fagot, Wightman. Motion carried.

Prior to the consideration of the next three items, Mayor Wightman requested item number 11 be considered directly after item number 6. He further declared a conflict of interest and stated that he would not enter into the discussion or voting concerning these matters. At this time, Mayor Wightman relinquished control of the meeting to Vice-President Hawks. Vice-President Hawks stated that item number 11 be considered after item number 5 and 6 as requested.

PUBLIC HEARING:

The Lexington City Council held a public hearing to consider a request to rezone a mobile home court at 1901 Plum Creek Parkway from C-3 Highway Commercial to R-4 Mobile Home Zone. Lauby addressed the Lexington City Council stating he is requesting a rezoning of his mobile home court to place it in proper zoning. Mr. Vance Bricker addressed the city council stating that this request channeled through had been the Commission and there was no opposition from the Planning Commission concerning this request as it would make the zoning in this area conform to the actual use of this area. Hearing no further comments, Vice President Hawks declared the public hearing closed.

An ordinance "AN ORDINANCE entitled. REZONE A TRACT OF LAND IN THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 17, TOWNSHIP 9 NORTH, RANGE 21 WEST OF THE 6TH P.M., IN THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, DAWSON COUNTY, NEBRASKA, FROM C-3 HIGHWAY COMMERCIAL TO R-4, MOBILE HOME DWELLING DISTRICT; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OR SECTIONS ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH: PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM." was read before the council. Moved by Anderson, seconded by Fagot that said ordinance be passed on first reading. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Fagot, Anderson, Hawks. Motion carried.

SPECIAL USE PERMIT:

The Lexington City Council held a public hearing to consider a request from Jim Lauby for a special use permit to expand his current mobile home court at 1901 Plum Creek Parkway. Mr. Lauby presented a drawing of his mobile home court and the part that would be extended. During the hearing, it was brought to the attention of the council that an extension of a road in a mobile home court would need to be a hard surface road as required by the Lexington City Code. Considerable discussion pertained to the surfacing of this road versus a rock and gravel base was considered during the public hearing with no remedy to the problem at hand and upon completion of the discussion, Vice President Hawks declared the public hearing closed. Additional discussion of the situation regarding the road was continued after the public hearing with questions to Bob Blankenship, representing Miller & Associates, if specifications could be drawn for the rocking of a road as opposed to the black topping or hard surfacing the road. Mr. Blankenship replied that he could have some specifications ready for the council at the next meeting. It was then moved by Fagot, seconded by Anderson to continue the public hearing until the first regular council meeting in March of 1995. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Anderson, Fagot, Hawks. Motion carried.

REQUEST TO EXTEND SUBDIVISION AGREEMENT:

The Lexington City Council considered a request from Jeff Konen to remove the twelve (12) month clause from the subdivision agreement for K & K Subdivision. Mr. Vance Bricker explained to council that at the time the subdivision agreement was passed, the clause was placed in that agreement whereby the plat would be vacated after a 12 month

period if no development had occurred. He further stated that this had been extended once before and they are now asking for the removal of this clause. Moved by Fagot, seconded by Anderson to approve the removal of the twelve (12) month limit in the subdivision agreement for K & K Subdivision. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Anderson, Fagot, Hawks. Motion carried.

ONE AND SIX YEAR ROAD PLAN:

The Lexington City Council held a public hearing to consider the one and six year road plan. Mr. Bob Blankenship, representing Miller & Associates, addressed the Lexington City Council stating that there had been no changes in the one and six year road plan from the workshop held at the last regular council meeting held February 14, 1995. Mr. John addressed the Lexington City Council Hines questioning the entrance road to the military museum and how the rerouting of this road would affect that entrance. Mr. Vance Bricker explained to Mr. Hines in detail where the road would be rerouted and how it would enter the military museum. Hearing no further comments, Mayor Wightman declared the public hearing closed. Moved by Hawks, seconded by Anderson that the following resolution be passed and Roll call. Voting "aye" were: approved. Anderson, Hawks, Wightman. Motion carried.

MANUFACTURED HOMES

An ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTIONS 25-1, 25-2 AND 28-9 OF THE LEXINGTON CITY CODE; TO MAKE PROVISION FOR LOCATION OF MANUFACTURED HOMES; TO REPEAL ORIGINAL SECTION 25-1, 25-2, AND 28-9 AND ALL OTHER ORDINANCES OR SECTIONS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM." was read before the council. Upon completion of the reading. moved by Hawks, seconded by Anderson that said ordinance be passed on final reading. Roll call. Voting "ave" were: Anderson, Fagot, Hawks, Wightman. Motion carried. The passage and adoption of said ordinance having been concurred by a majority of the Council, the President declared said ordinance b e adopted and signed the same. The Municipal Clerk attested to the passage and adoption of the ordinance by affixing his signature and the Seal of the City of Lexington in declaring Ordinance No. 2016 to be published in pamphlet form.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT:

The financial report for the City of Lexington including a budget recap was presented to the Lexington City Council by City Treasurer, Neldene Skwarek. Upon completion of the presentation, it was moved by Hawks, seconded by Anderson to approve the financial report for the City of Lexington for January, 1995. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Fagot, Anderson, Hawks, Wightman. Motion carried.

YOUTH COMMITTEE:

Mr. John Fagot addressed the Lexington City Council stating that he had, at a meeting in Lincoln, been inspired to recommend a committee made up of youths from schools that would serve on an advisory

committee to the Lexington City Council concerning youth activities and possibly recreation programs for the city. He stated that this committee could help with the decisions by giving their input for the swimming pool and recreation programs and possibly other activities involving the youth thereby making it more desirable for the youth to participation in activities. It was the consensus of the council that this idea should be pursued further and presented at the next regular council meeting. No further action was taken at this time.

EXECUTIVE SESSION:

Moved by Hawks, seconded by Anderson to recess the regular session to executive session at 8:37 p.m. to discuss the negotiation for sale of real estate owned by the City of Lexington. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Fagot, Anderson, Hawks Wightman. Motion carried. Moved by Anderson, seconded by Hawks to reconvene the regular scheduled session from executive session at 8:49 p.m. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Fagot, Hawks, Anderson, Wightman.

Motion carried.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Wightman declared the meeting adiourned.
