JOINT MEETING BOND ISSUES:

Mayor John Wightman addressed the members of the Lexington City Council and of the Lexington School Board stating that the citizens of the community voted in November for the approval of an additional 1/2 cent sales tax to be used for funding of a new city pool and help with the school facility. The revenues from this 1/2 cent sales tax could support a 4.3 million bond issue of which 1.8 would be designated for the aquatic center and 2.5 million for the school's use. The funding for the school could be used for the purchase of the middle school gym, renovation of the auditorium, cafeteria, the new high school gym and parking facilities. Mayor Wightman also stated that the 2.5 million would be split according to the size of the school bond issue which would be 62% for the middle school and 38% for the high school.

An item discussed was how the value of the middle school gym would be determined if the City were to purchase it with bond proceeds. Mr. Richard Peterson responded that the probable method to be used would be appraisal based on depreciated replacement cost. Another concern addressed was what happens if the sales tax bond issue fails. Mr. Jim Doyle stated that if the sales tax bond did not pass then it would be impossible for the school to do the entire project. If the high school bond passed and the sales tax use passed then you would continue with the high school project and like wise with the middle school so the real key is the sales tax use bond issue.

It was also addressed to the Council and the School Board that if a joint entity is formed then there would be joint ownership of the property. If there is joint ownership, then the facility would have to be available for public use, the entities would share the facilities. This is done many times in political subdivisions to share resources for economical reasons. The main function of this group would be to determine how this is going to be used and who is going to maintain it. Another idea discussed was entering into a 25 year contract which would ensure all the going ons and then using this board as an oversite committee to make sure that the contract was being enacted.

Other discussion pertained to the foundation's contributions. Some of the proceeds would be bonded in with the City's sale tax use bond issue as many of the donations would not be collected up front.

Councilperson Hawks moved that the concept of an interlocal agency agreement between the City and the Schools be adopted and that the two entities meet to work out an agreement for presentation for final approval at the April 25th meeting. Seconded by Fagot. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Anderson, Long, Fagot, Hawks and Wightman. Motion carried.

Councilperson Fagot moved that 2.7 million be bonded for the schools with 2.5 million from sales tax and to be slit 62% of the middle school and 38% for the high school and the \$200,000 for the auditorium. Seconded by Hawks. Voting "aye" were Long, Anderson, Hawks, Fagot and Wightman. Motion carried.

WAIVER OFMr. Vance Bricker presented to the Lexington CityOBJECTION:Council a waiver of objection for a lot split at 510West 7th Street which has two residents on one
piece of property and in order to sell these the
property needs to be split. Hearing no objections,

Councilperson Hawks moved that the waiver of objection for a lot split at 510 West 7th Street be approved. Seconded by Anderson. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Long, Fagot, Anderson, Hawks and Wightman. Motion carried.

- SIDEWALK INSTALLATION: City Manager Podraza addressed the Lexington City Council stating that there are requirements that when a house is built a sidewalk must be in place. Some years ago some houses or facilities were built and sidewalks were not installed, so the City is going to start to enforce this requirement. He also stated that in the past that if person ordered to install a sidewalk and if they didn't, the city would install it and then assessed the person. No action was taken.
- MITIGATION GRANT APPLICATION: Mr. Vance Bricker addressed the Lexington City Council that the Federal government has \$16 million for elimination of flooding and for mitigating processes to make sure flooding does not reoccur. This would work into the 13th Street project on sanitatary sewer improvement from Adams Street to Hampton Street and also would include storm sewer improvements on 13th Street from Adams 850 feet west which would take it to intercept the storm drain coming across the school from 15th Street and then include Lake Street North to 18th Street. This would be in the amount of \$750,000.

Councilperson Hawks moved that the administration be authorized to submit a mitigation grant application for a project related to storm water runoff in Northwest Lexington. Seconded by Long. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Fagot, Anderson, Long, Hawks and Wightman. Motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING PIZZA HUT: Mayor John Wightman declared the public hearing open. City Manager Podraza stated that Pizza Hut has an absenteeism owner who has requested to have the liquor license issued in his name. Hearing no further comments Mayor Wightman closed the public hearing. Councilperson Fagot moved that the application from Joseph M. Aragon for Peak Interests L.L.C. for a liquor license be approved. Seconded by Long. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Anderson, Hawks, Long, Fagot and Wightman. Motion carried. PAY ESTIMATE Mr. Dana Daniels presented to the Lexington City Council Pav Estimate No. 4 from Paulsen Development Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$55,349.41. This reflects a reduction in retainage to 5% and with a retainage of \$7,629.82. At this point Paulsens are substantial complete. All the concrete is in place and they have not done the grinding work or removal to eliminate the ponding of water. Mr. Daniels reviewed the diagram of Fillmore Street which highlights the areas holding water.

> After further discussion, Councilperson Long moved that Pay Estimate No. 4 from Paulsen Development Construction, Inc. for the Fillmore Street Project in the amount of \$45,000 be approved. Seconded by Hawks. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Fagot, Hawks, Long, and Wightman. Voting "na" were Anderson. Motion carried.

ADJOURNMENT: There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Wightman declared the meeting adjourned.
