A Regular Meeting of the Lexington City Council was held Tuesday, August 22, 1995, at the Municipal Building, 406 East 7th Street, Lexington, Nebraska, at 7:30 P.M. Members of the City Council present were: Mayor Robert Hawks, John Wightman, Dorothy Anderson, Jerry Long and John Fagot. City Officials present were: City Manager Bill Podraza, City Clerk Leon E. Malzahn and City Attorney Will Weinhold. Department Heads present were: Charles, Clark, Pete Bishop, Vance Bricker, Kerry Rader and City Intern Nathan Brown. Also present was Bob Blankenship representing Miller & Associates, Mel Uphoff, Terry Trueblood and Bill Fattig. The press was represented by the Kearney Hub, Tri-City Tribune and KRVN.

**CALL TO ORDER:** The meeting was called to order by Mayor Robert Hawks.

#### **PUBLIC HEARING:**

The Lexington City Council held a public hearing to consider the request of Bill Fattig for a change in zoning from A-1 to C-3. Mr. Fattig addressed the Lexington City Council stating that this property is located on the south side of I-80 and approximately one mile east of the Lexington interchange. After describing the property, he stated that he requested the rezoning of this property to construct a warehouse and showroom for his equipment. He further stated that drive-in traffic would not be a factor as 90% of the sales would occur away from the building. He then stated that his product line consisted of portable unloading pits and two designs of feedlot scrapers and that he would have an outside display of approximately 8 units. After completion of Mr. Fattig's presentation, Mr. Mel Uphoff presented a plot plan of the area that would be rezoned and its location relevant to other properties in the area.

Also speaking in favor of Mr. Fattig was Mr. Terry Trueblood who vouched for his method of operation, the cleanliness of his business, and the character of Mr. and Mrs. Fattig.

Speaking in opposition to the rezoning was Kerry Rader. Her objections to the rezoning was the placement of commercial property next to residential property in the A-1 zone that has been established and the increased traffic that it may cause.

Upon completion of the presentations for and against the rezoning of this property, Mayor Hawks declared the public hearing closed. An ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE TO REZONE LOT TWO (2) OF UPHOFF SUBDIVISION OF A TRACT OF LAND IN THE FRACTIONAL SOUTHEAST QUARTER (SE 1/4) OF SECTION TWENTY-ONE (21), TOWNSHIP

NINE (9) NORTH, RANGE TWENTY ONE (21), WEST OF THE 6TH P.M., DAWSON COUNTY, NEBRASKA, FROM A-1 AGRICULTURE TO C-3 HIGHWAY COMMERCIAL; to repeal all ordinances or sections of ordinances in conflict herewith; to provide for an effective date and for publication in pamphlet form." was read before the council. Moved by Fagot, seconded by Long that said ordinance be passed on first reading. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Fagot, Anderson, Long, Wightman, Hawks. Motion carried.

### **ZONING CHANGE:**

The Lexington City Council held a public hearing to consider the input on the change in the zoning ordinance concerning the regulations in the C-3 Speaking in favor of the ordinance was zones. Assistant City Manager Vance Bricker who stated to the Council that the passage of this ordinance would bring into compliance already existing conditions in the C-3 zoning by allowing office buildings within that zone. With no further comments and no objections to this ordinance, Mayor Hawks declared the public An ordinance entitled. hearing closed. ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 23-19.2 OF THE LEXINGTON CITY CODE; TO MAKE PROVISION FOR OFFICES AS A PERMITTED USE IN C-3 HIGHWAY COMMERCIAL ZONE: TO REPEAL ORIGINAL SECTION 28-19.2 AND ANY ORDINANCES OR SECTIONS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM." was read before the council. Moved by Wightman, seconded by Anderson that said ordinance be passed on first reading. Roll call. "ave" were: Long, Fagot, Anderson, Votina Wightman, Hawks. Motion carried.

# MANAGER APPLICATION:

The Lexington City Council considered a request

from the Eagle's Club to have Becky Fagot as its manager in accordance with the liquor license laws for the State of Nebraska. Upon reviewing the application with no negative comments, moved by Wightman, seconded by Long to approve the application of the Eagle's Club for Becky Fagot as manager of their liquor license. Roll call. Voting

"aye" were: Anderson, Long, Wightman, Hawks. Motion carried. Councilman Fagot abstained.

#### **PAY ESTIMATE:**

Mr. Bob Blankenship. representing Miller Associates addressed the Lexington City Council and presented them with Application No. 5 from Midlands Contractors for work completed on 13th Street. Mr. Blankenship then gave a progress report on the amount of construction that has been completed and stated that the current payment requested is in accordance with the amount of work completed. Upon completion of his presentation, moved by Wightman, seconded by Anderson that Application No. 5 to Midland Contracting in the amount of \$124,206.42 for construction work on 13th Street improvements Phase I be approved by the council and authorized the City Treasurer to transfer \$85,420.94 from LEXUS funds and \$38,785.48 from the General fund to the City of Lexington operating account for payment of the bill from Midland Contracting. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Fagot, Long, Anderson, Wightman, Hawks, Motion carried.

# MITIGATION GRANT CONTRACT:

City Manager Podraza presented a contract to the Lexington City Council for administration of the mitigation grant for improvements in the northwest part of town. Mr. Podraza stated that West Central Nebraska would be administering this grant and would receive a sum of \$21,800 for that service. With no further comments, moved by Wightman, seconded by Fagot to authorize the Mayor to enter into an agreement with West Central Nebraska Development District for administration of the Mitigation Grant. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Anderson, Long, Fagot, Wightman, Hawks. Motion carried.

#### BUDGET DISCUSSION:

City Manager Podraza reviewed the budget as presented to the City Council and would be considered in a hearing at 7:30 a.m. on August 29, 1995. Reviewing the budget, a question was raised concerning the revenues received for property taxes and the sales of lots and a recommendation was given that these would be included in this fiscal year's budget. Upon completion of the discussion and recommendations, no further action was taken.

# CERTIFICATE OF VOTES:

The Lexington City Council reviewed the Certificate of Votes as reported by the election commissioner of Dawson County. Councilmember Wightman offered the following resolution and moved for its adoption.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 95-11**

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor and Council hereby find and determine that pursuant to a resolution previously adopted, there was submitted to the electors of the City the question of issuing bonds in the amount of \$1,600,000 (Proposition No. 1) for the purpose of constructing a new swimming pool facility and related aquatic park improvements; that said question was duly submitted to the electors of the City at a special election held on August 8, 1995; that the County Clerk and County Canvassing Board for the County of Dawson have submitted their report of canvass with respect to said election, reflecting that the following votes were cast with respect to said proposition:

Ballots for said bonds and tax: 891

Ballots against said bonds and tax: 801

Ballots rejected and not counted: 0

That more than a majority of the electors of the City have authorized the issuance by the City of said bonds.

Section 2. The Mayor and Council of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, further find and determine that pursuant to a resolution previously adopted, there was submitted to the electors of the City the question of issuing bonds in the amount of \$2,900,000 (Proposition No. 2) for the purpose of purchasing an existing building or buildings, including related site, acquiring a site or sites including leasehold interests, constructing on such site or sites a public building or buildings and remodeling existing buildings for the

purpose of providing indoor athletic facilities, public auditorium facilities, including related parking facilities (either directly by the city of through the Lexington Community Facilities Agency) and providing furnishings and equipment for such public buildings; that said question was duly submitted to the electors of the City at a special election held on August 8, 1995; that the County Clerk and County Canvassing Board for the County of Dawson have submitted their report of canvass with respect to said election, reflecting that the following votes were cast with respect to said proposition:

The following councilmembers voted against: None. The passage of said resolution having been consented to by more than a majority of the members elected to the council. The mayor declared the resolution duly passed and adopted this 22nd day of August, 1995.

### SPECIAL MEETING:

The mayor stated that a special meeting of the Lexington City Council should be held August 29, 1995 at 7:30 a.m. and the Municipal Building for the purpose of conducting a public hearing for the fiscal year 95-96 budget. Moved by Wightman, seconded by Fagot that a special meeting of the Lexington City Council be held Tuesday, August 29, 1995 at 7:30 a.m. for the purpose of holding a public hearing on the fiscal year 1995-1996 budget. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Anderson, Long, Fagot, Wightman, Hawks. Motion carried.

### AWARD OF BIDS:

City Manager Podraza stated that two bids had been received for the digger derrick truck for use by the electric department. He stated that a bid from Trueco, Inc. was for \$36,300 and a bid from Cerco, Inc. in the amount of \$21,500. Mr. Pete Bishop of the electric department stated that the truck from Cerco would meet his requirements and requested this bid be accepted. Moved by Anderson, seconded by Wightman that the bid from Cerco, Inc. for a digger derrick truck for the City of Lexington in the amount of \$21,500 plus freight of \$350 be accepted and awarded. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Fagot, Long, Wightman, Anderson, Hawks. Motion carried.

# TREASURERS REPORT:

Kerry Rader, Lexington City Treasurer, reported the Treasurers Report for June, 1995 to the City Council. Upon completion of her report, moved by Wightman, seconded by Fagot to accept the Treasurers Report as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Long, Anderson, Fagot, Wightman, Hawks. Motion carried.

#### ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Hawks declared the meeting adjourned.
