BOND RESOLUTION:

Mr. Jim Fox representing Ameritas addressed the Lexington City Council stating that the City of Lexington should, by this resolution, call bonds of 1991 Series A Revenue Bonds and later on, by ordinance, issue refunding bonds in their place. The net result of this would be a reduction in interest rate, and a savings to the City. Councilmember Klamm offered the following resolution and moved its passage and adoption:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Lexington, Nebraska:

Section 1. The following bonds, in accordance with their option provisions are hereby called for payment on September 18, 1997, after which date interest on the bonds will cease:

Combined Revenue and Refunding Bonds, 1991 Series A, of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, date of original issue - November 1, 1991, in the principal amount of One Million Eight Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$1,825,000), numbered as shown on the books of the Paying Agent and Registrar, in denomination of \$5,000 each, becoming due and bearing interest as follows:

Said bonds are hereinafter referred to as the "Refunded Bonds."

Said bonds are subject to redemption at any time on or after September 1, 1996, at par and accrued interest, and said interest is payable semiannually. Said bonds were authorized by ordinance and were issued for the purpose of providing for payment of certain outstanding note indebtedness incurred to pay the costs of certain utility improvements and extensions.

Section 2. Said bonds are to be paid off at the office of Minden Exchange Bank and Trust Company, Minden, Nebraska, as successor paying agent and registrar (previously, Lexington State Bank and Trust Company, Lexington, Nebraska).

Section 3. A true copy of this resolution shall be filed immediately with Minden Exchange Bank and Trust Company, Minden, Nebraska, as Paying Agent and Registrar for the Refunded Bonds, and said Paying Agent and Registrar is hereby instructed to mail notice to each registered owner of said bonds not less than thirty days prior to the date fixed for redemption, all in accordance with the Ordinance authorizing said called bonds.

BOND ORDINANCE:

Councilmember Klamm introduced an Ordinance entitled:

An ordinance authorizing and providing for the issuance of combined utilities revenue refunding bonds, 1997 Series B, of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, in the aggregate principal amount of one million six hundred thirty thousand dollars (\$1,630,000) for the purpose of providing for the payment and redemption of the City's outstanding combined utilities revenue and refunding bonds, 1991 Series A, in the Principal amount of \$1,825,000; directing the application of the proceeds of said bonds; prescribing the form, terms and details of said bonds; pledging and hypothecating the revenue and earnings of the sewer, water and electric systems owned by the City for the payment of said bonds and interest thereon; establishing the terms upon which additional bonds of equal lien upon revenues may be issued: entering into a contract on behalf of the city with the owners of said bonds; selling the bonds and authorizing the delivery of the bonds to the purchaser; and providing for publication of this ordinance in pamphlet form.

Said Ordinance was fully and distinctly read, and by motion of Councilmember Klamm, seconded by Councilmember Kohl, it was designated as Ordinance No. 2084 and the title thereof was approved. The roll was called on the passage of said motion and the following voted "AYE": Mandelko, Fagot, Kohl, Klamm, Wightman. The following voted "NAY": none. Councilmember Klamm moved that the statutory rule requiring ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three

different days be suspended, seconded by Councilmember Kohl. The roll was called and the following voted "AYE"; Kohl, Mandelko, Klamm, Fagot, Wightman. The following voted "NAY": none. The motion to suspend the statutory rule having been concurred in by three-fourths of all members of the Council was declared passed and adopted.

Whereupon Ordinance No.2084 was read by title and thereafter Councilmember Klamm moved for final passage of said Ordinance. Councilmember Kohl seconded the motion. The Mayor stated: "The question is, shall Ordinance No. 2084 be passed and adopted?" The roll was called and the following voted "AYE": Fagot, Mandelko, Kohl, Klamm, Wightman. The following voted "NAY": none.

The passage and adoption of said Ordinance having been concurred with by a majority of all members elected to the Council, was by the Mayor declared passed and adopted, and the Mayor, in the presence of the Council, signed and approved said Ordinance, and the Clerk attested the passage and approval of the same and affixed the seal of the City thereto.

Voting "aye" were: Kohl, Fagot, Mandelko, Klamm, Wightman. Motion carried. Said ordinance was then read by title. Moved by Kohl, seconded by Klamm, that Ordinance No. 22085 be passed on final reading. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Mandelko, Fagot, Klamm, Kohl, Wightman. Motion carried.

The passage and adoption of said Ordinance having been concurred with by a majority of all members elected to the Council, was by the Mayor declared passed and adopted, and the Mayor, in the presence of the Council, signed and approved said Ordinance, and the Clerk attested the passage and approval of the same and affixed the seal of the City thereto.

WATER SYSTEM STUDY:

Mr. Dana Daniels, representing Miller and Associates, addressed the Lexington City Council, outlining the subjects that would be covered in the water system study for the City of Lexington. Mr. Daniels went into detail on the computer animation of the water system that would be performed to achieve the highest efficiency in the design. Mr. Daniels also stated that the questions of development of well fields and the possibility of treating water which would be a federal regulation that would be worked into the plan. Concluding his presentation, Mr. Daniels stated that this study would cost approximately \$48,000.00, and would layout a plan of work which could be followed for the next 10 to 20 years. Upon the completion of his presentation, the City Council wished to hold off on approval of this presentation until the budgets for the City could be reviewed one more time prior to final adoption. No further action was taken.

MEETING CHANGE:

City Manager Vance Bricker, stated that the next regular Council meeting would be held at the same time as the Dawson Area Development Annual Meeting, and therefore, in order to attend that, the Council Meeting needed to be moved. Upon the completion of his presentation, moved by Mandelko, seconded by Kohl, that the next regular meeting of the Lexington City Council be held August 26, 1997 at 7:00 a.m. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Klamm, Fagot, Kohl, Mandelko, Wightman. Motion carried.

City Manager Bricker then stated that a budget meeting would need to be set. Moved by Kohl, seconded by Fagot, that a budget meeting be set for Tuesday, August 19, 1997 at 7:00 a.m. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Mandelko, Klamm, Fagot, Kohl, Wightman. Motion carried.

WATER RATES:

City Manager Vance Bricker started off the presentation by stating that with the increased cost of wells and the conditions that existed this summer, the City would need to increase water rates to make capitol available to invest in production equipment for the water department. He further stated that Assistant City Manager Joe Pepplitsch had worked on the water rates and would carry on the presentation from this point. Assistant City Manager Joe Pepplitsch presented a resolution to the City Council with the proposed water rate increase, stating that this increase would make the move from flat rate to metered water revenue neutral and allow the City of Lexington to obtain capitol for the construction projects that will be required to pour an adequate supply of water to the citizens of Lexington. After a discussion pertaining to a \$2.00 flat charge for customers who aren't able to buy water that is distributed among multi-family residential users containing a flat rate charge to make it a fair and equitable rate between the rate customers. The following resolution was read before the Council. Moved by Mandelko, seconded by Klamm that the following resolution be passed and approved. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Fagot, Kohl, Klamm, Mandelko, Wightman. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO. 97-16

WHEREAS, Lexington City Code Section 27-34, authorizes the City Council to establish by Resolution a schedule of rates and charges for water use.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA, that Resolution No. 84-13 is amended to provide water rates as follows:

Residential and Commercial Metered:

First 5,000 gallons \$1.40 per 1,000 gallon \$7.00 monthly minimum

Next 5,000 gallons \$.50 per 1,000 gallon Max of \$9.50 for 10,000 gal. Use

Next 10,000 gallons \$.40 per 1,000 gallon Max of \$13.50 for 20,000 gal. Use

Next 30,000 gallons \$.30 per 1,000 gallon Max of \$22.50 for 50,000 gal. Use

>50,000 gallons \$.25 per 1,000 gallon

Residential Flat Rate: \$10.00 per dwelling unit

per month.

That all other water rates previously established shall remain unchanged.

PAY ESTIMATE:

The Lexington City Council reviewed Pay Estimate No. 13 and 14, from Paulson Inc. of Cozad, Nebraska for the general contract at the Pool. At this time, there were questions raised about the drainage problem in the pool and the on the grounds at the pool, and that water had been puddling, and a remedy to this needed to be addressed prior

to approval. Upon completion of discussion, moved by Klamm, seconded by Kohl, to table the Pay Estimate until the regular meeting on August 26, 1997. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Mandelko, Fagot, Kohl, Klamm, Wightman. Motion carried.

SANITARY SEWER REPORT:

Mr. Dana Daniels representing Miller and Associates presented a report to the Lexington City Council outlining their findings on the 20th Street Sanitary Sewer Line and the possibilities that may exist with the sewage back-up which occurred in three houses in that area. Also in this study was a recommendation for modifications to the existing lines which represented an effort to alleviate this problem. City Manager Bricker stated that Midlands Construction would be in town to construct the Cedar Street Water Main Project and at that time, can do an addendum to their contract, adding this 8 inch main which would remedy a problem that could exist. No further action was taken.

EXECUTIVE SESSION:

Moved by Fagot, seconded by Kohl to recess the Regular to Executive Session at 10:00 p.m. in order to discuss personnel. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Mandelko, Klamm, Kohl, Fagot, Wightman. Motion carried.

Moved by Kohl, seconded by Mandelko to reconvene the Regular Session at 10:16 p.m. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Fagot, Klamm, Mandelko, Kohl, Wightman. Motion carried.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Wightman declared the meeting adjourned.
