**OVERPASS RESOLUTION:** Assistant City Manager Pepplitsch informed the Council that during the traffic studies conducted by the Department of Roads, it was determined that the current overpass may need to be upgraded from a two (2) lane structure to four (4) lanes. He further explained that this Resolution would place Lexington's name in the Queue for funding part of this project. ## **RESOLUTION 99-33**

WHEREAS, increased traffic volume on South Highway 283 at the Union Pacific railroad viaduct has become a public safety concern, and warrants expansion to a four-lane structure.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA, that the State of Nebraska Department of Roads is hereby requested to consider improvement of the Union Pacific Railroad viaduct on South Highway 283 to a four lane structure, with the understanding that the City of Lexington will be required to share in the cost of such project according to State and Federal policies.
