Mr. Jim Doyle addressed the Lexington City Council and introduced Mr. Doug LIBRARY REPORT: Evans from Research Associates. During his introduction, Mr. Doyle informed the Council of the Survey that was taken by Research Associates for the City to determine a need in the City for an expansion or renovation of the Library. With that, Mr. Doyle yielded the podium to Mr. Evans. Mr. Doug Evans reviewed the report he submitted, that was produced from the survey of library needs, highlighting some of the areas that would indicate the need to expand or renovate the current library. Upon the completion of Mr. Evan's report, Mr. Jim Doyle addressed the City Council requesting that the Council assist the Library Board in the formation of a Committee to further study the needs and possible improvements to the library. Upon the completion of his request, Mr. Kermit Debban addressed the City Council stating that he had some concerns and would like to know what direction the Library is taking, as his house would be directly next door to the Library, and any construction on the Library would definitely affect the property of his location. Upon the completion of the request, and comments by Mr. Debban, moved by Klamm, seconded by Wightman, that the City of Lexington form a Committee to aid the Library Board in guidance and direction on a possible expansion of the Library. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Kohl, Cook, Wightman, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried. TRANSFER OF FUNDS: Mr. Jim Doyle stated that the City of Lexington holds money that has been donated to the Library, for Friends of the Library, and is that requesting the money be transferred to the Library Foundation for its handling. Upon review of

money be transferred to the Library Foundation for its handling. Upon review of the proposed resolution, and after their review, Council Person Klamm moved that the following resolution be passed and approved. Council Person Wightman seconded the motion. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Cook, Kohl, Wightman, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

### **RESOLUTION NO. 99-24**

WHEREAS, the Lexington City Treasurer has control of a Library Building Fund account which consists of public donations to the City Library, and income from those donations; and

WHEREAS, said funds are to be transferred to the Lexington foundation for diversification of the investment and to facilitate a public fund raising effort.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the mayor and Council of the city of Lexington, Nebraska, as follows:

- That the Lexington City Treasurer is hereby authorized to transfer the Library Building Fund account to the custody of the Lexington Foundation, for such investment as such is permitted by Sec. 77-2341 R.R.S. 1943, and subject to normal administrative expense.
- 2. That such transferred funds shall be held in trust for the purpose of paying the cost of improvements and additions to the Lexington Public Library building, as such expenditures are approved jointly by the Lexington Library Board and the Lexington City Council.

- **3.** That as additional donations or net income from the rental property are received, the Lexington City Treasurer is further authorized and director to transfer said funds to the Lexington Foundation upon the same terms and conditions.
- **4.** As a further condition for transfer of said funds, the Lexington Foundation shall provide at least quarterly a report showing the investments held, and income received for said building account, and said investments and reports shall be further subject to the annual financial audit of the city of Lexington, Nebraska.
