to consider setting the tax requested which is different than the tax requested last year. City Manager Vance Bricker addressed the Lexington City Council stating that there was no increase in the General Fund request. The increase in Debt Service is due to the bond payments coming due on the 13th Street Project. There being no further comments, Mayor Fagot declared the public hearing closed.

were, Cook Kohl, Klamm, Wightman and Fagot Motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO. 99-26

WHEREAS, Nebraska Revised Statutes Section 77-1601.02 authorizes the governing body to set a final property tax request at a different amount than the property tax request for the prior year; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Lexington, Nebraska has conducted a public hearing as prescribed by law and heard and considered comments concerning the need to establish a different property tax request;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Council of the City of Lexington, Nebraska hereby finds and determines that it is in the best interests of the Municipality that the property tax request be set at a different amount than the request for the previous year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA, that the property tax request for the Municipality for the fiscal year 1999-2000 is set at \$430,008.00.

Moved by Wightman, seconded by Klamm, that the rules requiring the reading of said ordinance on three separate days be suspended. Roll call. Voting "aye" were: Cook, Kohl, , Klamm , Wightman and Fagot. Motion carried. Said Ordinance was then read by title. Moved by Wightman seconded by Klamm, that Ordinance No. 2113 be passed on final

reading. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Kohl, Cook , Klamm, Wightman and Fagot. Motion carried.

The passage of said Ordinance having been concurred with by a majority of all members elected to the Council, was by the Mayor declared passed and adopted, and the Mayor, in the presence of the Council, signed and approved said Ordinance, and the Clerk attested the passage and approval of the same and affixed the seal of the City thereto.

JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 99-27

WHEREAS, the City of Lexington and Dawson County have proposed construction of Cattlemen Drive, as a road to link Adams Street to Plum Creek Parkway, and running generally along the south line of the Northwest Quarter of Sec. 8-9-21; and

WHEREAS, both Cattlemen Drive and South Adams Street from West Walnut Street south to Cattlemen Drive are partially outside of the Lexington corporate limits; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that a proposed Cattlemen Drive and the segment of South Adams Street from West Walnut Street south to Cattlemen Drive should be reclassified.

The Mayor and Council of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, and the Board of Commissioners of Dawson County, Nebraska, therefore jointly resolve as follows:

- 1. That the State Department of Roads is hereby requested to classify the portion of Cattlemen Drive within the Lexington Urban Area Boundary as "urban minor arterial", and classify the portion of Cattlemen Drive outside of the Lexington Urban Area Boundary as "county major collector".
- 2. That the State of Nebraska Department of Roads is hereby requested to classify South Adams Street from West Walnut Street south to Cattlemen Drive as "urban minor arterial".
- **3**. That the State of Nebraska Department of Roads, upon the completion of construction of Cattlemen Drive, is hereby requested to classify West Walnut Street from South Adams Street east to Plum Creek Parkway as "urban collector".
