PUBLIC HEARING:	 Mayor Fagot opened the public hearing. City Manager Joe Pepplitsch addressed the Lexington City Council informing them that there had been no comments made regarding the rezoning of property located at the "City Compost Site" on East Walnut Street, Lexington, NE. The request was to have the property rezoned from M-2 to A-2. The Public Hearing was closed by Mayor Fagot. Following discussion, an Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO REZONE LOTS 2 & 3, BLOCK G. OF THE SUBDIVISION OF SECTION 5-9-21, IN THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, DAWSON COUNTY, NEBRASKA, FROM M-2 HEAVY INDUSTRIAL TO A-2, URBAN RESERVE DISTRICT; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OR SECTIONS OF ORDINANCES INCONFLICT HEREWITH; TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM" was read before the Council. Moved by Klamm, seconded by Wightman, that the rules requiring the reading of said Ordinance on three separate days be suspended. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Cook, Kohl, Wightman, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.
PUBLIC HEARING:	Mayor Fagot opened the public hearing. City Manager Joe Pepplitsch addressed the City Council stating that this Ordinance, that was tabled at the last meeting, is being brought before the Council again. The Ordinance would regulate the distance between Billboards in the City of Lexington. Following discussion, Mayor Fagot closed the Public Hearing. Moved by Wightman, seconded by Kohl, to pass the following Ordinance on First Reading, with the language in Part B read "Off-premises advertising signs shall be located so that a minimum distance of six hundred feet (600') exists between signs on the same side of the street". Roll call. Voting "aye" were Klamm, Cook, Kohl, Wightman, Fagot. Motion carried.
