**PUBLIC HEARING:** 

Upon Mayor Fagot declaring the Public Hearing open, Mr. Jerry Barnes addressed the Lexington City Council, voicing his opposition to the continuance of a Special Use Permit for Joe Rios and Connie Foster, whose property is located at the Corner of Road 436 and Highway 30, Lexington, NE. Mr. Barnes stated that he didn't believe the foundation under the Trailer located on the property, was yet completed, but was informed that the space located in the foundation was considered the crawl space, and will be used for a well house. City Manager Joe Pepplitsch informed the City Council that the property has now been brought up to code, and is in compliance with the City Building Code. Following discussion by Connie Foster, and the Lexington City Council, Mayor Fagot declared the Public Hearing closed. Moved by Wightman, seconded by Klamm, to continue the Special Use Permit by Joe Rios and Connie Foster for property located at the corner of Road 436 and Highway 30, Lexington, Nebraska, on the basis that the owners have brought the property into compliance with Lexington City Code. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Kohl, Cook, Klamm, Wightman, Fagot. Motion carried.

**NUISANCE ENFORCEMENT:** 

Council Person Neal Kohl addressed the Lexington City Council stating that the people living in the 2 mile zoning jurisdiction outside the City limits, have no one to enforce any nuisance codes for that area, and would like to see something done. City Attorney Willard Weinhold informed the City Council that there are many issues that would have to be addressed should this be enforced. Following a statement by Denzel Mills, Jerry Barnes and Connie Foster, and discussion by the Council, it was determined to have Administration investigate this issue further, and approach it again at a future City Council Meeting.

NEBRASKA WATER USERS ASSOCIATION:

Council Person Ted Cook addressed the Lexington City Council stating that the Nebraska Water Users would like the Lexington City Council's support of their statement of Principles and Positions Relating to Continuation of the Cooperative Agreement and Adoption of a Proposed Program, and would recommend that the Council approve the Resolution adopting their Statement. Moved by Klamm, seconded by Wightman, to approve the following Resolution. Roll call. Voting "ave" were Cook, Kohl, Wightman, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

## ORDINANCE NO. 2132

AN ORDINANCE DIRECTING THE SALE OF LOTS C, E, AND G, IN THE REPLAT OF LOTS 1-11, BLOCK 2, SOUTHAVEN ADDITION TO THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, DAWSON COUNTY, NEBRASKA; TO PROVIDE FOR PUBLICATION AND THE RIGHT OF REMONSTRANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> That the real estate hereinafter described is owned by the City of Lexington, Nebraska, and is surplus to the needs of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, and should be sold to RON STAHLA and MARY STAHLA.

Section 2. That the real estate to be sold is described as Lots C, E, and G, in the Replat of Lots 1-11, Block 2, SOUTHAVEN ADDITION TO THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, DAWSON COUNTY, NEBRASKA; (407 Oregon Trail, 415 Oregon Trail, and 507 Oregon Trail)

<u>Section 3.</u> The purchaser shall pay for such real estate the sum of \$16,500.00, payable as follows:

- A down payment of \$300, and the remaining balance to be due in certified funds on the date of closing.
- b. Purchaser shall pay one-half of the cost of title insurance;
- c. Estimated closing date will be on or about November 1, 2000.

Section 4. That immediately upon adoption, notice of this Ordinance shall be published in a legal newspaper for three (3) consecutive weeks; that if remonstrance against such sale signed by legal electors equal in number to thirty percent (30%) of the electors of the City voting at the last regular municipal election shall be filed with the Lexington City Clerk within thirty (30) days of such publication, such property shall not then, nor within one (1) year thereafter be sold.
