LIBRARY BOARD REPORT:

Mr. Jim Doyle, representing the Lexington Library Board addressed the Lexington City Council, requesting the Council's help in proceeding with the Library Project. They believe that there is a need for thorough and complete communication between the Library Board and City Council, and the best method for this would be to form a joint committee. Following discussion, moved by Klamm, seconded by Cook, to appoint Steve Tomasek, and Rick Klamm to sit on the Joint Committee for the Library Project, along with three other public Members-At-Large, and two members from the Library Board. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Klamm, Tomasek, Cook, Fagot. Motion carried.

Councilman Cook expressed his concerns regarding funding for the Library Project. He requested that the City Manager gather information necessary for Council to look into this, at the next meeting.

LIBRARY HOURS:

Councilman Ted Cook, addressed the Council, stating that at one time the Public Library was open on Sundays, and he would like to know what could be done to restore the Sunday hours. Mr. Jim Doyle, representing the Library Board, informed Councilman Cook that the Board would look into it, and see what the costs would be.

SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS:

City Manager Pepplitsch addressed the Lexington City Council stating that before them is a Resolution to consider unpaid assessments on District 96-03. Payments have not been made in the past three years, and if Council would consider them delinquent, they would carry a rate of 14% on the initial assessment. Following discussion, Resolution Number 01-01 was read before the Council. Moved by Klamm, seconded by Salem, to adopt Resolution Number 01-01. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Cook, Tomasek, Salem, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 5-11; TO PROVIDE FOR RABIES VACCINATION RECORDS; TO REPEAL SECTIONS 5-9 AND 5-10, THEREBY ELIMINATING THE REQUIREMENT OF DOG AND CAT LICENSES; TO REPEAL ORIGINAL SECTION 5-11 AND ALL OTHER ORDINANCES OR SECTIONS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM" was read before the Council. Moved by Klamm,

seconded by Tomasek, that the rules requiring the reading of said ordinance on three separate days be suspended. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Cook, Tomasek, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

Said Ordinance was then read by title. Moved by Klamm, seconded by Salem, that Ordinance No. 2136 be passed on final reading. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Cook, Salem, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE:

City Manager Pepplitsch addressed the Lexington City Council, recommending that they amend Section 8 of the Lexington City Code dealing with the Electric Service. Following discussion, and review of the recommended amendments, an Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTIONS 8-2, 8-3, 8-4, 8-5, 8-6, 8-7, 8-8, 8-9, 8-10, 8-11, 8-12, 8-13, AND 8-19, AND TO ADOPT NEW SECTIONS 8-5A, 8-10A, 8-20, AND 8-21 OF THE LEXINGTON CITY CODE; TO AMEND AND UPDATE THE CITY CODE PROVISIONS RELATING TO ELECTRICAL SERVICE; TO REPEAL ORIGINAL SECTIONS 8-2, 8-3, 8-4, 8-5, 8-6, 8-7, 8-8, 8-9, 8-10, 8-11, 8-12, 8-13, AND 8-19, AND ALL OTHER ORDINANCES OR SECTIONS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM" was read before the Council. Moved by Klamm, seconded by Tomasek, to approve said Ordinance on first reading. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Cook, Tomasek, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

PRODUCTION COST ADDER CHARGES:

City Manager Pepplitsch addressed the Lexington City Council stating that NPPD has informed the City that they will be implementing a 2001 PCA. City Manager Pepplitsch indicated that it would be beneficial to put the PCA on for a 12-month period, which would be \$.00194 per Kwh Following discussion, moved by Klamm, seconded by Cook, that the City of Lexington set the Production Cost Adder at a factor of \$.00194 per Kwh effective for January 2001 use. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Tomasek, Cook, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Financial Director Barb Mills, presented the Financial Report for December, 2000. Following her presentation, moved by Klamm, seconded by Salem, to accept the Financial Report for December, 2000. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Cook, Salem, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Fagot declared the meeting adjourned.
