PUBLIC HEARING:

Mayor Fagot opening the Public Hearing, and Dave Smith, attorney representing Paulsen Inc., addressed the Lexington City Council, requesting property located at 43434 Heartland Road be rezoned from A-1 to M-2. Following Mr. Smith's presentation, discussion was held by Council. Mayor Fagot closed the Public Hearing. An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO REZONE A TRACT OF LAND IN THE NORTH ONE-HALF OF THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 21-9-21 FROM A-1 AGRICULTURAL TO M-2 HEAVY INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OR SECTIONS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM" was read before the Council. Moved by Klamm, seconded by Tomasek, to pass Ordinance on First Reading. Voting "aye" were Cook, Tomasek, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

SPECIAL USE:

Moved by Klamm, seconded by Cook, to table the request by Paulsen, Inc. for a Special Use Permit on property located at 43434 Heartland Road, for use as a Concrete Plant, until the next City Council Meeting scheduled for May 22, 2001. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Cook, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

SPEED LIMITS:

Pepplitsch addressed the City Council stating his proposal of setting the Speed Limit on Cattlemen Drive at 35 mph. Following discussion by Council, an Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 16-41 OF THE LEXINGTON CITY CODE; TO PROVIDE FOR SPEED LIMITS ON CATTLEMEN'S DRIVE; TO REPEAL ORIGINAL SECTION 16-41, AND ALL OTHER ORDINANCES OR SECTIONS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM" was read before the Council. Moved by Klamm, seconded by Tomasek, to adopt Ordinance on First Reading. Voting "aye" were Cook, Tomasek, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

STOP SIGNS:

Pepplitsch addressed the City Council recommending traffic controls at the intersection of Cattlemen Drive and Adams Street. Following discussion by Council, moved by Klamm, seconded by Cook, to approve Resolution No. 01-09. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Cook, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO. 01-09

Whereas, Code Section 16-14 gives the City Council authority to revise the location of stop signs by Resolution.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA AS FOLLOWS:

That the Lexington city Manager is hereby authorized and directed to install stop signs at the intersection of Cattlemen's Drive and south Adams Street, requiring west-bound traffic to stop at that intersection.

Bob Blankenship, representing Miller and Associates, addressed the City Council requesting payment to Paulsen Inc. in the amount of \$46,692.00 for work completed on Cattlemen Drive. Following discussion, moved by Klamm, seconded by Tomasek, to approve Pay Request Number One to Paulsen Inc., in the amount of \$46,692.00. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Cook, Tomasek, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.
