	A RESOLUTION TO PROVIDE FOR ASSESSMENT OF CHARGES FOR AMBULANCE SERVICE PROVIDED WITH FIRE DEPARTMENT EQUIPMENT AND PERSONNEL; TO PROVIDE A RESTRICTED USE FOR THE NET PROCEEDS FROM SUCH CHARGES;
	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA, AS FOLLOWS;

That commencing October 1, 2003, the City of Lexington, Nebraska will charge for ambulance service by the Lexington Volunteer Fire Department as follows:

1. The charge for transporting a patient shall be \$360.00, plus actual mileage at the rate of \$10.00 per loaded mile;

2. The charge shall apply to all calls requiring transport of a patient, whether in the City, Rural District, or Mutual Aid;

3. The City will employ the services of an independent billing agency to perform all necessary work for billing and collection of such charges; A copy of monthly accounting for billings and monthly fund accounting shall be provided to Department personnel.

4. An amount equivalent to ten percent (10%) of the net amount collected for ambulance services, not to exceed \$20,000.00 in any City fiscal year, shall be paid monthly to the Lexington Volunteer Fire Department separate account to be used for meeting and training expenses;

5. The balance of net amount collected shall be credited to a separate account to be used for the sole purpose of capital expenditures for fire and rescue equipment for the Fire Department;
