The meeting was called to order by Mayor Fagot.

Following discussion, moved by Tomasek, seconded by Salem, to approve Pay Request No. 26 for the Municipal Wastewater Pretreatment Facility, to Wanzek Construction. Inc., in the amount of \$337,823.04. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Klamm, Cook, Salem, Tomasek, Fagot. Motion carried.

PAY REQUEST:

Pepplitsch requested Council's approval of Pav Request No. 7 for the Municipal Wastewater Pretreatment Facility. Following discussion, moved by Klamm, seconded by Tomasek, to approve Pay Request No. 7 for the Municipal Wastewater Pretreatment Facility, to Wanzek Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$337,823.04. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Cook, Salem, Tomasek, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

HISTORIAL LIGHTING:

Pepplitsch requested Council award a bid for the Lexington Main Street Historical Lighting Project. Following discussion, moved by Klamm, seconded by Tomasek, to award the bid for the Lexington Main Street Historical Lighting Project to Dutton Lainson of Hastings, NE in the amount of \$68,001.00. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Cook, Tomasek, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

FIRE DEPARTMENT TRUCK: Dale Holbein, representing the Lexington Volunteer Fire Department, requested Council authorize the Fire Department to advertise for bids for a new 1,500 gallon Fire Department Pumper. It was reported that the 1980 International Pumper that the Fire Department currently has, would be sold. Following discussion, moved by Klamm, seconded by Salem, to authorize the Lexington Volunteer Fire Department to advertise for bids for a new Fire Department Pumper. Roll call.

Voting "aye" were Cook, Tomasek, Salem, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

PLANNING COMMISSION APPOINTMENT:

Mayor Fagot reported that Mr. Kevin Kisker has resigned from the Lexington Planning Commission, due to his acceptance of a new job in Des Moines, Iowa. To replace Mr. Kisker, Mayor Fagot nominated Mr. Curt Bennett to fill the vacancy left on the Lexington Planning Commission. Following discussion, moved by Klamm, seconded by Salem, to ratify Mayor Fagot's recommendation of appointing Mr. Curt Bennett to the Lexington Planning Commission. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Cook, Salem, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION:

Pepplitsch informed the City Council, that a Report from BCDM Consultants had been received regarding the needs of the Lexington Municipal Building. Participation from two City Council Members was requested in an effort to review the report, and work on the project. Councilmen Cook and Klamm volunteered to participate.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business to come before Council Mayor Fagot declared the meeting adjourned.
