ORDINANCE:	Mayor Fagot requested input on a proposed Ordinance to regulate the presence of minors in licensed liquor establishments. An Amendment was recommended, indicating the provisions in the Ordinance would not apply to licensed premises whose primary business is providing food, lodging, or a bowling alley. Following discussion, moved by Cook, seconded by Klamm, to amend Section 1c in the proposed Ordinance to state the provisions in the Ordinance would not apply to licensed premises whose primary business is providing food, lodging, or a bowling alley. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Klamm, Cook, Fagot. Motion carried.
	An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE PRESENCE OF MINORS IN PREMISES LICENSED FOR THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OR SECTIONS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM" was read before Council. Moved by Klamm, seconded by Salem, to adopt amended Ordinance on First Reading. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Cook, Salem, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.
PUBLIC HEARING:	Mayor Fagot opened the Public Hearing. Lisa Yan, representing China Red II, requested Council's approval of a Class "A" Liquor License, for her business located at 413 N. Washington, Lexington, NE. Following discussion, Mayor Fagot closed the Public Hearing. Moved by Klamm, seconded by Salem, to recommend approval of the Class "A" Liquor License, for China Red II, located at 413 N. Washington, Lexington, NE. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Cook, Salem, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.
TENNIS COURTS:	Mr. Ernie French, representing the Lexington Tennis Association, requested Council's approval to name the Tennis Courts at Plum Creek Park, the "Champions Tennis Complex", and the Tennis Courts at Memorial Park, the "Mary Maloley Tennis Complex". Following Mr. French's presentation, and discussion by the Council, moved by Salem, seconded by Klamm, to table this item, so that Councilman Salem, and one other City Councilman, could meet with Mr. French and the Lexington Tennis Association, to discuss this further. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Cook, Klamm, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.
PUBLIC HEARING:	Mayor Fagot opened the Public Hearing. Pepplitsch requested Council's approval of the One and Six Year Street Improvement Plan, and presented a summary of the projects in the Plan. Following Pepplitsch's presentation, Mr. Frank Hennigan expressed his concerns regarding Item #5 (Program No. $92 - 20^{\text{th}}$ & Park Streets) in the One Year Plan. Mr. Jim O'Donnell also expressed his concerns regarding the same item. Following discussion, moved by Klamm, seconded by Salem, to approve the One and Six Year Street Improvement Plan. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Cook, Salem, Klamm, Fagot. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT:	Pepplitsch requested Council's approval of the Financial Report for January, 2004. Following discussion, moved by Salem, seconded by Klamm, to accept the Financial Report for January, 2004. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Cook, Klamm, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.
EXECUTIVE SESSION:	With the absence of Councilman Tomasek, Mayor Fagot requested this item be tabled until all Councilmen could be present.
ADJOURNMENT:	There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Fagot declared the meeting adjourned.
