RESOLUTION NO. 04-09

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, DAWSON COUNTY, NEBRASKA, AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CREATION OF THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ADVISORY BOARD.

WHEREAS, the growth of the economy of the City of Lexington is critical to the city's ability to grow and prosper in the future; and

WHEREAS, it is vital for Lexington to develop techniques that will encourage this necessary economic growth; and

WHEREAS, it is important to have public input, direction, and education in the planning and implementation of community development activities; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council desire to proceed into the future with organized community development efforts within and surrounding Lexington;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF LEXINGTON THAT:

- The Community Development Advisory Board (CDAB) is created to review, advise, and give direction on general policy and planning pertaining to community development activities; and
- The CDAB shall consist of six (6) members, which individuals shall be the Lexington City Manager, the Lexington Chamber of Commerce Director, the Greater Lexington Corporation President, the Council for Economic Development (CED) President, CED Vice President, and the CED Treasurer; and
- 3. The CDAB shall meet monthly to discuss community development issues initiated by public and private organizations, and participate in City planning activities when scheduled; and
- 4. The CDAB shall elect within its membership a Chairman and Vice-Chairman on an annual basis; and
- 5. The CDAB shall report to the City Council on a monthly basis of findings and recommendations pertaining to community development policy; and
- 6. The CDAB shall receive an annual allocation of funds necessary to carry out its duty; and
- The operation of the CDAB shall commence upon adoption of this Resolution and continue until terminated by a majority vote of the City Council.
