AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE THAT PORTION OF TYLER STREET LYING BETWEEN EAST 12<sup>TH</sup> STREET AND EAST 11<sup>TH</sup> STREET; TO PROVIDE FOR REVERSION OF THE VACATED STREET TO ADJOINING PROPERTY OWNERS; TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That it is in the best interest of the municipality that a portion of Tyler Street lying between East 12<sup>th</sup> Street and East 11<sup>th</sup> Street be privately owned and maintained by the adjoining owners, and that such portion of street should be vacated.

Section 2. That the City of Lexington, Nebraska hereby vacates that portion of Tyler Street lying between East 12<sup>th</sup> Street and East 11<sup>th</sup> Street.

Section 3. That the vacated street right-of-way shall revert to the adjoining owners of Block 4 and Block 5, MacColl and Leflang's Third Addition to the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form and take effect as provided by law.
