Pool Procedures

COVID-19 Pool Rules and Regulations:

1. COVID-19 Warning Sign Placed at Entrance

a. COVID-19 WARNING

- i. The danger of exposure to the coronavirus that causes COVID-19 exists.
- ii. By entering the LFAC, you take responsibility for your own protection and for disinfecting your hands and anything you touch in the pool area.
- iii. Do not use the LFAC if you have a cough, fever or other symptoms of illness.
- iv. Maintain at least 6 feet between you and other people who are not a part of your household.
- v. Wear a face covering when you are in the bathhouse and common spaces outside of the swimming pool.
- vi. Sanitization and social distancing procedures are in place, but you may enter at your own risk.

2. LFAC Entry

- a. Prior to entering the aquatic center, the "COVID-19: PUBLIC FACILITY USER AGREEMENT" must be signed by any patron 18 years of age or older, and a parent or legal guardian must sign for any patron 17 years old or younger
- b. 25-Patron Rule: Abide by the 25-patron rule at the five (5) designated swim zones
 - i. Top Pool: Lap Swim Lanes 6-8 and Deep End (Zone 1) max. 15 patrons
 - ii. Top Pool: Southeast section (Zone 2) max. 15 patrons
 - iii. Top Pool: Northeast section (Zone 3) max. 15 patrons
 - iv. West half of zero entry pool (Zone 4) max. 25 patrons
 - v. East half of zero entry pool (Zone 5) max. 25 patrons
 - vi. The zero entry pool zones will be roped off and monitored by guards and staff to ensure patrons remain in their swim zones
 - vii. Patrons will remain in their respective swim zones they are assigned or sign-up for during the entire swim session (no switching zone-to-zone)
- c. Call-in Reservations will be recommended but not required; walk-ins will be allowed to enter LFAC so long as maximum patron capacity is not exceeded in each zone and all entrance requirements are met (i.e. waiver, temperature check, etc.)
- d. Wait outside the pool door in marked area for entry time

- i. Entrance through the bathhouse will be staggered one person or same family/party group at a time
- ii. LFAC Staff will notify each same-party group/individual when they may enter
- e. Patron touchless temperature checks upon entry and a daily log will be kept
- f. Written list of all patrons—first & last name, phone, temperature will be recorded
- g. Front desk staff member will take reservations and record name, number, family/same-party group size, and time requesting admission to the pool
- h. Staff is to wear gloves while taking money/stamping punch cards
- i. All staff and all patrons are required to wear masks at all times inside the pool house.
- j. 6 Foot Social Distancing is required at all times
- k. Staff will monitor 6ft social distancing rule of those inside the bathhouse, gathering areas and the pool area
- I. Staff will monitor bathrooms to ensure one individual or family is in there at a time
- m. Staff will monitor the entrance to ensure patrons meet the following criteria:
 - i. Temperature Check
 - ii. COVID-19: Public Facility User Agreement is signed
 - iii. Capacity limits are not being exceeded in the designated swim zones

3. LFAC Exit

- a. Patrons will Exit out through the SW Gate
- b. Patrons will be allowed to enter the bathhouse to use the restroom so long as it is limited to one person or one family or same-party group at a time

4. Sanitization

- a. Patrons will sign-up via phone or walk-in request for 75-minute time slots
- b. Hand Sanitizer will be provided throughout the pool areas
 - i. Front Desk
 - ii. Bathhouse
 - 1. Hand Sanitizer minimum 60% alcohol per CDC recommendations
- c. 30-minute sanitization segments will occur between each swim session
 - i. Spray down and sanitization will occur at but not limited to:
 - 1. Countertops
 - 2. Ladders
 - 3. Benches/Chairs
 - 4. Door Handles
 - 5. All locker room areas (sinks, toilets, handles, showers, etc.)
 - 6. CDC recommends soap and water for areas not frequently touched
 - ii. Outside pool concrete areas

- 1. Ensure no standing water anywhere on concrete
- iii. Bathroom Sanitization
 - 1. Chlorinate floors a minimum of twice daily

5. Employees

- a. Employee temperature checks: touchless temperature checks will be performed at the start of each shift
- b. Affidavit signed by parents acknowledging the risks associated with COVID-19
- c. Affidavit signed by all employees 18 and older acknowledging the risks associated with COVID-19

6. First-Aid

- a. Regular First-Aid protocols will be followed for First-Aid and blood borne pathogens
- b. "The risk of disease transmission is extremely low while performing CPR - - especially when using a breathing barrier." – American Red Cross Scientific Advisory Council
- c. The CDC does waive all social distancing requirements in case of an emergency

7. Pool Operations

- a. Hours of Operations
 - i. Top Pool: Zones 1-3, Zero Entry Pool: Zones 4-5
 - ii. All patrons must exit and no one may enter LFAC during the 30minute intervals for cleaning
 - 1. Monday Thursday
 - a. Swim Sessions
 - i. 9:30 10:45 am (Lap Swim Only)
 - ii. 10:45 am 12:00 pm Closed for Cleaning
 - iii. 12:00 2:00 pm (Swim)
 - iv. 2:00 2:30 pm Closed for Cleaning
 - v. 2:30 4:30 pm (Swim)
 - vi. 4:30 5:00 pm Closed for Cleaning
 - vii. 5:00 7:00 pm (Swim)
 - 2. Friday
 - a. Swim Sessions
 - i. 12:00 2:00 pm (Swim)
 - ii. 2:00 2:30 pm Closed for Cleaning
 - iii. 2:30 4:30 pm (Swim)
 - 3. Saturday Sunday
 - a. Swim Sessions
 - i. 1:00 3:00 pm (Swim)
 - ii. 3:00 3:30 pm Closed for Cleaning

- iii. 3:30 5:30 pm (Swim)
- b. Admission Fees/Season Pool Pass
 - i. Day Pass:
 - 1. \$2.25 0-15 yrs. old
 - 2. \$3.25 16-54 yrs. old
 - 3. \$2.25 55+
 - ii. Punch Card:
 - 1. \$25.00 10 punches
 - iii. Season Pass:
 - 1. \$50.00 Individual
 - 2. \$110.00 Family Pass
- c. Current Procedures (prior to COVID-19)
 - i. Continue in-service trainings/meetings
 - 1. 4-hours/month per Red Cross recommendations
 - ii. All procedures and protocols involving pool water chemistry, emergency response, equipment availability and maintenance, record-keeping and reporting, disinfecting, etc. that will be performed at the pool are in accordance with Title 178 NAC 2 published by the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services
 - 1. Chemical levels are required to be checked at least every 4 hours and records kept of every check
 - 2. Required Chlorine level ranges from 2-10 ppm
 - iii. No face coverings in the water

8. Temporary Programs/Equipment Closed or On-Hold Until Further Notice

- a. Private Swim Lessons
- b. Red Cross Swim Lessons
- c. Swim Team
- d. Diving Boards
- e. Water Slides
- f. Kids' Water Equipment/Slide
- g. Splash-Pad

CDC - - There is no evidence that the virus that causes COVID-19 can spread directly to humans from water in pools, hot tubs or spas, or water play areas. Proper operation, maintenance, and disinfection (for example, with chlorine or bromine) of pools, hot tubs or spas, and water playgrounds should kill the virus that causes COVID-19. However, there are additional concerns with outdoor areas that may be maintained less frequently, including playgrounds, or other facilities located within local, state, or national parks.

The guidelines are subject to change as new guidance is received. The Lexington Family Aquatic Center will shut down immediately upon any directed health measure that requires the city to do so.

1. RELEASE, WAIVE, DISCHARGE AND COVENANT NOT TO SUE the City of Lexington (hereinafter, Municipality), together with each such Municipality's mayor and council, manager/administrator, clerk, agents and employees, (all of whom are collectively referred to herein as "Releasees") from any and all liability to the User (or User's personal representatives, assigns, heirs, parents, legal guardians, siblings, children or dependents) on account of injury, illness, disease, quarantine or death from the COVID-19 coronavirus and any complication or related disease or condition, occurring as a result of entering the property of any such Municipality and utilizing said property either as a guest or participant whether such injury, sickness, disease, condition, or death is caused by the negligence or other wrongful conduct of one or more of the Releasees or whether liability for such injury, sickness,

THE PERSON SIGNING BELOW AGREE(S) to comply with all federal, state and local laws and regulations, all directed health measures and guidelines, and all security policies or procedures established by any such Municipality relating to COVID-19 or other safety or hygiene precautions, understanding that the Municipality may elect to deny entrance to the property (including any facilities present thereon) and the User may not be allowed to enter a facility or utilize or continue to utilize Municipality facilities at any time. The undersigned agree(s) that in the event any portion of this document is held to be invalid, the balance shall, notwithstanding, continue in full legal force and effect to the greatest extent possible under applicable law. The parents or guardian of the User on whose behalf they have signed, to the maximum extent permitted by applicable law to this Agreement in full.
