Lexington Airport Authority Meeting Minutes

Airport Authority Regular Monthly Meeting

Monday, July 20, 2026, 7pm, Jim Kelly Field.

Other attendees: David Margritz

In attendance were Margritz, Smith, and Adams. Also in attendance was airport manager Nathan Masten and David Margritz.

Adams called the meeting to order at 7:01pm. Adams cited the open meeting statute, posted on the whiteboard in the conference room.

Approve minutes of June 15, 2026 regular meeting:

- Margritz made a motion to accept the minutes of the June 15 regular meeting. Smith seconded the motion. All voted aye, none voted nay.

Approve and pay July 2026 bills:

- Adams made a motion to pay the July bills in the amount of \$22,095.36. Smith seconded the motion. All voted aye, none voted nay.

Review "Budget vs. Actual" report:

- The Budget vs. Actual report was reviewed. No action was required.

Airport Manager's Comments:

- Bosselman Fuel was out of jet fuel and, more recently, avgas. They brought a transport of jet fuel Sunday afternoon. Nathan notated that we are currently out. We will have someone come look at the pump, as it's not working.
- We are supposed to get a load of avgas tomorrow (Tuesday, July 21).
- The John Deere tractor developed a fuel leak. Landmark came and fixed it (fuel pump). The Grasshopper clutch was repaired as well (reflected in Landmark bill).
- Nathan negotiated with Landmark to get a better deal on the skid steer. They would drop it from \$10,000 to \$8,000 (up from \$4500).
- Oshkosh is in progress. We've been off and on busy.
- Nathan found a concrete heave on the runway and contacted Paulsen. They came out and fixed it immediately; we were closed for two days while it happened.
- There was a lightning strike on a hay bale in the west field.

Old Business:

- Dwayne Margritz hangar letter questions: options for Dwayne Margritz's hangar were discussed. \$6,235 county valuation. Tabled for 30 days.

New Business:

- Adams made a motion to sign the letter of understanding for the budget agreement with Contryman Associated. Smith seconded the motion. All voted aye, none voted nay.
- Smith made a motion to accept the audit results from RJ Meyer. Adams seconded the motion. All voted aye, none voted nay.
- Adams made a motion to pay the audit bill for RJ Meyer in the amount of \$11,800.00. Smith seconded the motion. All voted aye, none voted nay.
- Adams made a motion to submit Resolution No. 2026-07 as a preliminary tax request for \$168,352.00, (normal tax levy plus \$25,000 for our 10% of capital improvement funds) pending an estimate for capital improvement funds. Margritz seconded the motion. All voted aye, none voted nay.
- The YMCA Transportation Celebration will be held at the airport on Saturday, September 26 from 10am-2pm. Adams made a motion to rent two port-a-potties for the event. Smith seconded the motion. All voted aye, none voted nay.

Meeting adjourned at 7:49pm.
