**PUBLIC HEARING:** 

Mayor Fagot continued the public hearing to consider a special use application by Viaero to construct an 85 foot tower A-2 Zone, located at 305 East 20<sup>th</sup>. The hearing was tabled from previous meetings. Chris Riha, Viaero, gave a presentation regarding the proposed site. Following Riha's presentation, Dan Lindstrom, general counsel for Viaero, provided additional information tower location opposition. Dave Gordon, 2002 Polk, reiterated his opposition to the proposed tower being located adjacent to his property. Riha addressed the Council on his efforts to discuss the issue with property owners in the area. Lindstrom reiterated the different characteristics of wireless technology and coverage issues. Fagot asked for other comments, being none, the public hearing was closed. Weinhold noted that the Council may want to go into emergency closed session in order to receive legal advice. Moved by Miller, seconded by Salem, to go into emergency closed session for the purpose of receiving legal advice. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Bennett, Salem, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried. Council went into emergency closed session for the purpose of receiving legal advice at 6:35 pm.

Moved by Tomasek, seconded by Bennett, to come out of emergency closed session for the purpose of receiving legal advice at 6:40 pm. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Miller, Bennett, Tomasek, Fagot. Motion carried.

Following Council discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Tomasek, to approve the special use permit application by Viaero Wireless as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Bennett, Tomasek, Miller. Voting "no" were Salem, Fagot. Motion carries.

**SOCCER FIELD BIDS:** Dana Daniels presented Council with bid tabulation for the Optimist Complex Soccer Field Improvement project. He reported that both bids received were not within the bid guidelines and were only for sprinkler system installation. Following review of the bid information, it was recommended to award a contract for the sprinkler system installation. Pepplitsch reported that the fine grading and seeding may be accomplished through negotiation. Following discussion, moved by Tomasek, seconded by Salem, to waive irregularities of the bids received, award the sprinkler system installation portion of the bid to Hoehner Turf Irrigation II for the sprinkler system in the amount of \$32,465.00, and authorize the City Manager to negotiate for fine grading and seeding improvements. Roll call. Voting "ave" were Miller, Bennett, Salem, Tomasek, Fagot. Motion carried.

FLUORIDATION LEGISLATION:	Pepplitsch reviewed information regarding rules and regulations of adding fluoride to the local drinking water system, as recently mandated by state statute. He reported that the drinking water in Lexington has naturally occurring fluoride at levels that may not require further addition. He also indicated that statute does allow an opt-out provision for local voters. Rita Wagner, a concerned citizen, presented information the dangers of adding sodium silica fluoride to the drinking water. Following discussion, Council directed the City Manager to work with NHHS on a waiver and report back in early August.
PAY REQUEST:	Daniels presented Pay Request #3 from Cement Products Inc for the Lexington Pedestrian/Bike Trail in the amount of \$53,608.19. He gave an update of the project and recommended payment. Moved by Miller, seconded by Bennett, to approve Pay Request #3 as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Tomasek, Bennett, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.
CHANGE ORDER:	Daniels presented Change Order #2 on the Spring Creek Box Culvert project and gave an update of the project. Following discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Tomasek, to approve the change order as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Bennett, Tomasek, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.
PAY REQUEST:	Daniels presented Pay Request #3 and Final from LJ Webb Contractor Inc for the Spring Creek Box Culvert project in the amount of \$19,351.93. Moved by Bennett, seconded by Tomasek, to approve the pay request as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Miller, Tomasek, Bennett, Fagot. Motion carried.
FINANCIAL REPORT:	Pepplitsch presented a financial report for May 2008. Following discussion, moved by Salem, seconded by Miller, to accept the financial report as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Bennett, Miller, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.
ROUNDTABLE:	Pepplitsch reported that a draft of the General Fund budget will be sent to council members by July 25 <sup>th</sup> and a draft of the Utility budget will likely follow by July 28 <sup>th</sup> . He requested a budget session at the next council meeting, scheduled for August 12 <sup>th</sup> . Following discussion regarding attendance at the next regularly scheduled meeting, moved by Salem, seconded by Miller, to move the next council meeting to Tuesday, August 5, 2008. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Bennett, Miller, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.
	Burnside noted that a new police officer, Lance Blythe, will be starting employment on July 28 <sup>th</sup> . Council requested that recently hired officers attend a meeting to meet the Council.
	Salem questioned the status of nuisance abatement at the intersection of Hwy 30 and Rd 436.
ADJOURNMENT:	There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Fagot declared the meeting adjourned.
