## **RESOLUTION NO. 08-21**

## A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE AMENDED AND RESTATED PENSION PLANS FOR THE MONEY ACCUMULATION PLAN FOR EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON AND THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA POLICE OFFICERS' PENSION PLAN, WHICH INCLUDE APPLICABLE CHANGES IN THE TAX QUALIFICATION LAWS THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2007.

- 1. Adoption of Amendment and Restatement of the Money Accumulation Pension Plan for Employees of the City of Lexington: NOW, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City shall amend and restate and it hereby does adopt, the amended and restated Money Accumulation Pension Plan for Employees of the City of Lexington (the "Money Accumulation Plan"), in the form of the Plan document attached hereto and by this reference fully incorporated herein. The purpose of said amendment is to adopt the amendments for tax-qualified government retirement plans under the Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001, the Pension Funding Act of 2004, the American Jobs Creation Act of 2004, the Gulf Opportunity Zone Act of 2005, certain changes under the Pension Protection Act of 2006, and such other changes required by applicable law or as otherwise determined to be necessary and appropriate by the City.
- 2. Adoption of Amendment and Restatement of the City of Lexington, <u>Nebraska Police Officers' Pension Plan:</u> NOW, BE IT RESOLVED, that in order to adopt the amendments required for tax-qualified retirement plans under the Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001, the Pension Funding Act of 2004, the American Jobs Creation Act of 2004, the Gulf Opportunity Zone Act of 2005, certain changes under the Pension Protection Act of 2006, and all other tax laws enacted since the City of Lexington, Nebraska Police Officers' Pension Plan ("the Plan") was last amended, as such laws apply to government plans, and to make certain other amendments to the Plan as required by applicable tax laws and regulations, the Plan shall be, and it hereby is, amended and restated effective January 1, 2008 in the form of

the Plan document submitted at this meeting and by this reference made a part of this resolution.

3. Authorizations: NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and other appropriate elected officials and officers of the City of Lexington shall be, and they hereby are, authorized to do all things necessary to carry out and accomplish the foregoing Resolution, including the execution of any document or amendment which may be necessary or appropriate to amend and administer the amended and restated pension plans, including such actions as may be necessary or appropriate to achieve and maintain qualification of the aforesaid Plans under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, as said sections apply to government plans. **PASSED AND APPROVED** THIS 10<sup>th</sup> DAY OF NOVEMBER. 2008. The economic impact of losing the Tenneco facility was discussed, from a local and regional perspective. Following discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Tomasek, to approve a pledge of \$100,000.00 of CDBG Re-use funds toward the Tenneco retention project. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Bennett, Tomasek, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried. **ORGANIZATION MEETING:** Council discussed scheduling an organizational meeting for the first Tuesday of December. Following discussion, moved by Bennett, seconded by Tomasek, to schedule an organizational meeting for December 2, 2008, at 7:30 a.m. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Miller, Tomasek, Bennett, Fagot. Motion carried. PLANNING SESSION: Council discussed scheduling a planning session, as well as possible agenda items. Following discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Tomasek, to schedule a planning session for December 6, 2008, at 8 a.m. Roll call. Voting "ave" were Salem, Bennett, Tomasek, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried. **ROUNDTABLE:** Burnside reported that the installation of new playground equipment in Oak Park will begin this week. Berke noted that the annual awards banquet will be held on Saturday, January 10, 2009, at the Holiday Inn Express. More information will follow.
