- **CDBG ADMINISTRATION:** Pepplitsch presented Council with a proposal from Dawson Area Development for CDBG general administration services for the Downtown Revitalization Study. He noted this was the only proposal received. Following discussion, moved by Salem, seconded by Tomasek, to award the contract to Dawson Area Development and authorize Mayor and City Manager to execute required documents. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Miller, Bennett, Tomasek, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.
- **CDBG SPECIAL CONDITIONS:** Pepplitsch presented documents related to special conditions for the CDBG 09-DTR-004 Downtown Revitalization Study. He explained these include the Environmental Review, Authorization to Request Funds, Financial Management Certification, Procurement Standards, Excessive Force Certification, and Fair Housing Policy. Following discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Tomasek, to authorize the Mayor and City Manager to execute the CDBG Special Conditions documents. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Bennett, Tomasek, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.
- **SOCCER BUILDING:** Pepplitsch presented bids received for the Soccer Field Restroom Facility, noting that Paulsen Inc. was the low bidder on the project. He noted that the bids were substantially higher than anticipated costs. Following discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Salem, to reject the bids received and authorize the city manager to negotiate a contract for the project with the lowest bidder. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Bennett, Salem, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.
- **SUBDIVISION AGREEMENT:** Pepplitsch reviewed a Subdivision agreement for Northwest Third Addition. Following discussion, moved by Tomasek, seconded by Bennett, to approve the subdivision agreement and to authorize the Mayor to execute documents on behalf of the city as a subdivider. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Miller, Bennett, Tomasek, Fagot. Motion carried.
- **DEVELOPMENT AGMT:** Pepplitsch presented a development agreement between Greater Lexington Corp and the City for the Northwest Third Addition. Weinhold noted an error in one of the legal descriptions. Following discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Bennett, to approve the development agreement with a correction to the legal description in Paragraph 2. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Tomasek, Bennett, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.
- **SANITATION RATES:** Resolution No. 09-29 was presented for Council consideration. Pepplitsch explained that Dan's Sanitation is requesting a 4% increase for residential garbage collection services. Following discussion, moved by Salem, seconded by Tomasek, to approve Resolution No. 09-29 as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Miller, Bennett, Tomasek, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

	BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that effective January 1, 2010, the charge to be collected for residential garbage pickup within the City of Lexington shall be \$13.50 per month, plus an administrative charge of \$0.50, for a total of \$14.00 per month.
	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that effective January 1, 2010, the charge for residential customers who are single and 65 years of age or older shall be \$11.50, plus administrative charge of \$0.50, for a total of \$12.00 per month.
