## **PUBLIC HEARING:**

Mayor Fagot opened a public hearing tabled from the March 23<sup>rd</sup> council meeting regarding the addition of space to the existing liquor license for Rodriguez Restaurante, Inc. dba Premier Night Club, to encompass the Derek Mitchell reviewed supplemental information entire building. including past building lease agreements and plans for operation of the facility. Fagot questioned if permits for any renovations had been obtained. Mitchell reported that there are no renovations being done at this time, just general clean-up and maintenance. He stated that the business owners were under the impression that the liquor license covered the entire building. He noted that they had submitted paperwork to extend the license in 2007 and believed the east portion of the building was covered. It was only recently discovered that the license did not cover that portion. The public hearing was closed. Following discussion, moved by Tomasek, seconded by Miller, to recommend approval of the addition application as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Bennett, Miller, Tomasek, Fagot. Motion carried.

**RENTAL AGREEMENT:** Pepplitsch reviewed a rental agreement with the Lexington School District for a portion of the Opportunity Center. Following discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Tomasek, to authorize the City Manager to enter into a rental agreement with the Lexington School District #1 for the Opportunity Center. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Bennett, Salem, Tomasek, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.

SUBDIVISION:	Pepplitsch presented the final plat of the CED Second Addition, a proposed subdivision in the southwest area of town. He noted that the plat had been reviewed by the Planning Commission, who recommended Council approval. Following discussion, Resolution No. 2010-10 was presented. Moved by Miller, seconded by Tomasek, to approve Resolution No. 2010-10 as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Bennett, Tomasek, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.
