A Regular Meeting of the Lexington City Council was held Tuesday, November 23, 2010, at the Lexington Municipal Building, located at 406 E. 7th Street, Lexington, Nebraska at 5:30 p.m. Members of the Council present were John Fagot, Steve Tomasek, Joni Bennett, Linda Miller and John Salem. City Officials present were City Manager Joe Pepplitsch, Assistant City Manager Dennis Burnside, City Attorney Will Weinhold, Finance Director Barb Mills, and Deputy City Clerk Pamela Berke. The press was represented by the Kearney Hub, Lexington Clipper-Herald, and KRVN Radio. Also in attendance were Dana Daniels, Jeremy Bals and Andrew Stark, and other interested parties.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Fagot. Fagot informed the public that the Open Meetings Act is posted in the Meeting Room at the Lexington Municipal Building, located at 406 E. 7th Street, Lexington, Nebraska.

SPECIAL USE PERMIT:

Mayor Fagot opened a public hearing to consider a special use permit application by USA Communications to construct a 150' communications tower at Lot 1, Tract G, Lexington, on the east end of the Lexington Livestock property. Jeremy Bals presented the application and noted that the tower would enhance their broadband internet service in the Lexington area, that approval of the tower height from the Airport Authority and FAA had been gained, and that the property used to erect the tower would be leased. When questioned about co-locating on the existing tower in that area, he explained that it was determined to be cost prohibitive. abandonment of the equipment was a concern of the Planning Commission in their recommendation for approval of the application, Bals noted that language regarding any abandonment is written into the lease agreement and could be included in any agreement with the city. There being no other public comments, the public hearing was closed. Following discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Salem, to approve the special use application and to authorize the city manager to execute a special use permit agreement with USA Communications and the property owner. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Bennett, Salem, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.

1&6 STREET IMPROVEMENT AMENDMENT:

Resolution No. 2010-27 was presented for Council consideration. Pepplitsch noted that Lexington has the opportunity to work with NDOR to utilize federal aid for an additional 2011 street project that would not require additional ROW or extensive environmental review. He proposed a resurfacing project including 17th Street between Polk and Adams Streets, and Walnut Street between Van Buren and Madison Streets. To move forward, this project would need to be identified in the city's 1-year Street Improvement Plan through plan amendment, and reviewed a proposed amendment. Following discussion, moved by Salem, seconded by Miller to approve Resolution No. 2010-27 as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Bennett, Miller, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

Moved by Tomasek, seconded by Salem, to schedule an organizational meeting on Tuesday, December 7, 2010, at 7:30 a.m. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Miller, Bennett, Salem, Tomasek, Fagot. Motion carried.

NW 3RD INFRASTRUCTURE:

Dana Daniels presented closeout documents for the Northwest 3rd Addition Infrastructure Improvement project. Daniels reviewed Pay Request #2(Final) from Paulsen, Inc. in the amount of \$157,065.36. Moved by Salem, seconded by Miller to approve the pay request as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Bennett, Miller, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

Daniels presented a Certificate of Substantial Completion for the project. Moved by Miller seconded by Salem, to approve the certificate as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Bennett, Tomasek, Salem, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.

PAY REQUEST:

Pepplitsch reviewed Pay Request #9 from Paulsen Inc. for the Municipal Building project in the amount of \$45,225.49. Following discussion, moved by

Tomasek, seconded by Salem, to approve the pay request as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Bennett, Miller, Salem, Tomasek, Fagot. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Pepplitsch reviewed an October 2010 financial report. Following discussion,

moved by Salem, seconded by Bennett, to accept the financial report as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Tomasek, Miller, Bennett, Salem,

Fagot. Motion carried.

ROUNDTABLE: Fagot reported on a project by the Lexington Middle School 8th grade class to

generate discussion on the acquisition and renovation of the Majestic Theatre in

downtown Lexington.

ADJOURNMENT: There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Fagot

declared the meeting adjourned.
