The proceeds of the Refunded Bonds were used to 1) pay costs of extending, enlarging, and improving the City's sewage disposal plant and sanitary sewer system; 2) make a deposit into the Bond Reserve Account with respect to the Refunded Bonds; and 3) pay the costs of issuance.

Section 2. The Refunded Bonds are to be paid at the office of the Treasurer of the City of Lexington, Lexington, Nebraska, as paying agent and registrar (the "Paying Agent and Registrar").

Section 3. A true copy of this resolution shall be filed immediately with the Paying Agent and Registrar and said Paying Agent and Registrar is hereby instructed to mail notice to each registered owner of said bonds and give notice to The Depository Trust Company in accordance with its standard procedures not less than thirty days prior to the date fixed for redemption, all in accordance with the ordinance authorizing the Refunded Bonds.

ORDINANCE: Ordinance No. 2296 entitled "AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF COMBINED UTILITIES REVENUE REFUNDING BONDS, 2011 SERIES, OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA, IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF ONE MILLION SIX HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,650,000) FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FOR PAYMENT AND REDEMPTION OF THE THE CITY'S **OUTSTANDING COMBINED UTILITIES REVENUE BONDS**, 2004 SERIES; DIRECTING THE APPLICATION OF THE PROCEEDS OF SAID BONDS: PRESCRIBING THE FORM, TERMS AND DETAILS OF SAID BONDS; PLEDGING AND HYPOTHECATING THE REVENUE AND EARNINGS OF THE SEWER, WATER AND ELECTRIC SYSTEMS OWNED BY THE CITY FOR THE PAYMENT OF SAID BONDS AND INTEREST THEREON: ESTABLISHING THE TERMS UPON WHICH ADDITIONAL BONDS OF EOUAL LIEN UPON REVENUES MAY BE ISSUED; ENTERING INTO A CONTRACT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY WITH THE OWNERS OF SAID BONDS; SELLING THE BONDS AND AUTHORIZING THE DELIVERY OF THE BONDS TO THE PURCHASER; AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE IN PAMPHLET FORM" was read.
