ALCOHOL SALES: Pepplitsch reviewed a request to extend the sale of alcohol until 2:00 am on June 13 and 14, coinciding with the Plum Creek Rodeo, and June 20 and 21, coinciding with Alumni Events. Victor Diaz noted that Community Preventative Service Task Force recommends limited hours for on premise alcohol sales and noted their concerns related to extended time for alcohol consumption, lack of taxi service in the community, and late hours for designated drivers. Mayor Fagot related the bar owners reasoning for requesting extended hours is the additional cost of entertainment during those weekends and noted that this is for special events only. Pepplitsch noted that the hours have been extended for these weekends in past years and there have not been any reported issues. Following discussion, moved by Salem, seconded by Miller, to approve the extension of alcohol sales until 2:00 am on June 14, 15, 21, and 22, 2014. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Vivas, Roberts, Miller, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried. Diane Adams, Lexington Housing Authority, requested a waiver of the Payment in Lieu of Taxes agreement with the City of Lexington. Following discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Roberts, to approve a waiver of the PILOT agreement for fiscal year 2014. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Vivas, Salem, Roberts, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING: Mayor Fagot opened a public hearing to consider a rezoning application by GJT LLC for property located at 1610 North Washington, from C-O Neighborhood Commercial to R-3 High Density Residential. Todd Booth, GJT LLC, reviewed his plans for 12 to 14 apartments to be constructed in the current building, using local contractors as much as possible with potential completion within 6 months. There being no further comments, the public hearing was closed. Ordinance No. 2347 entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO REZONE LOTS 10, 11, AND 12, BLOCK 2, LEXINGTON HEIGHTS ADDITION FROM C-O NEIGHBORHOOD COMMERCIAL TO R-3 HIGH DENSITY RESIDENTIAL; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OR SECTIONS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH: TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM" was presented on first reading. Moved by Salem, seconded by Roberts, to approve Ordinance No. 2347 on first reading. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Miller, Vivas, Roberts, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION: Resolution No. 2014-17 was presented. Brad Slaughter, Ameritas, reviewed the proposed refinancing of the Series 2009 Combined Utilities Revenue Refunding Bonds at a 6.1% present value savings. He noted that a bank note payoff for the automated metering project will be included in the new bond. Following discussion, moved by Salem, seconded by Vivas, to approve Resolution No. 2014-17. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Miller, Roberts, Vivas, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Lexington, Nebraska:

Section 1. The following bonds of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, in accordance with their option provisions are hereby called for payment on July 1, 2014, after which date interest on the bonds will cease:

Combined Utilities Revenue Refunding Bonds, 2009 Series, of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, date of original issue - May 12, 2009, outstanding in the principal amount of Two Million Nine Hundred Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$2,990,000), numbered as shown on the books of the Paying Agent and Registrar, in denomination of \$5,000 each, becoming due and bearing interest as follows:

Said bonds are hereinafter referred to as the "Refunded Bonds."

The Refunded Bonds are subject to redemption at any time on or after May 12, 2014, at par and accrued interest, and said interest is payable semiannually. The proceeds of the Refunded Bonds were used for the purpose of providing funds for: 1) refunding on May 12, 2009, Combined Utilities Revenue and Refunding Bonds, 2002 Series, of the City, date of original issue – September 27, 2002; 2) refunding on May 12, 2009, Combined Utilities Revenue Bonds, 2003 Series, of the City, date of original issue – December 16, 2003; 3) making a deposit into the Debt Service Reserve Account with respect to the Series 2009 Bonds; and 4) paying the cost of issuance of the Series 2009 Bonds.

Section 2. The Refunded Bonds are to be paid at the office of the Treasurer of the City of Lexington, Lexington, Nebraska, as paying agent and registrar (the "Paying Agent and Registrar").

Section 3. A true copy of this resolution shall be filed immediately with the Paying Agent and Registrar and said Paying Agent and Registrar is hereby instructed to mail notice to each registered owner of said bonds and give notice to The Depository Trust Company in accordance with its standard procedures not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date fixed for redemption, all in accordance with the ordinance authorizing the Refunded Bonds.

	DELIVERY OF THE BONDS TO THE PURCHASER; AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE IN PAMPHLET FORM" was presented. Moved by Salem, seconded by Miller to suspend the rules regarding the reading of an ordinance on three separate occasions. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Vivas, Roberts, Miller, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

Voting "aye" were Vivas, Salem, Roberts, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.
CONTRACT:	Pepplitsch reviewed an operating agreement with West Central Area Agency on Aging for the Meals Program for FY 2015. Following discussion, moved by Miller, seconded by Vivas, to approve the operating contract as presented and to authorize the execution of necessary documents. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Roberts, Vivas, Miller, Fagot. Motion carried.
ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION:	Pepplitsch gave an update on the Optimist Recreation Complex Lighting project, noting that the project will be operational by the end of the week.
	Burnside reminded Council and Staff of the Public Open House for the 6 th and Grant/Taft Streets project scheduled for Thursday, May 29, 2014, in the Council Chambers, beginning at 5:30 p.m.
ADJOURNMENT:	There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Fagot declared the meeting adjourned.
