A Regular Meeting of the Lexington City Council was held Tuesday, November 8, 2022, at Lexington, Nebraska at 5:30 p.m. Members of the Council present were John Fagot, John Salem, Dora Vivas, Steve Smith and Jeremy Roberts. City Officials present were City Manager Joe Pepplitsch, Assistant City Manager Dennis Burnside, City Attorney Brian Copley, and Finance Director Barb Hodges. The press was represented by the Clipper-Herald.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Brian Neben addressed the Council regarding planning for the 150-year celebration of Lexington in 2024.

PUBLIC HEARING: Mayor Fagot opened a public hearing to consider a Liquor License Application by MET Shortstop LLC dba Mac's Short Stop for a Class D liquor license. Jeff Tappan outlined his application with the current purchase of Mac's Short Stop. The public hearing was closed. Following discussion, moved by Roberts, seconded by Salem, to recommend approval to the Liquor Control Commission of the Class D license application by MET Shortshop LLC dba Mac's Short Stop. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Vivas, Smith, Salem, Roberts, Fagot. Motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING: Mayor Fagot opened a public hearing on a general redevelopment plan for Redevelopment Area #6. Pepplitsch reviewed the general plan, and also noted the Planning Commission reviewed the proposed plan and recommends approval. Being no public comments, the public hearing was closed. Resolution No. 2022-25 was presented. Following discussion, moved by Salem, seconded by Smith, to approve Resolution No. 2022-25. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Vivas, Roberts, Smith, Salem, Fagot. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-25

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA, APPROVING THE CITY OF LEXINGTON GENERAL REDEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR REDEVELOPMENT AREA #6; AND APPROVAL OF RELATED ACTIONS

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA:

Recitals:

- a. The Mayor and Council of the City of Lexington, Nebraska (the "City"), upon the recommendation of the City Planning Commission (the "Planning Commission"), and in compliance with all public notice requirements imposed by the Community Development Law, Chapter 18, Article 21, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended (the "Act"), has previously declared an area, including an area legally described on the attached Exhibit A (the "Redevelopment Area"), to be blighted and substandard and in need of redevelopment; and
- b. The Community Development Agency of Lexington, Nebraska (the "Agency") has prepared a redevelopment plan (the "Redevelopment Plan") a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B; and
- c. The Agency submitted the Redevelopment Plan to the Planning Commission for its recommendation on the Redevelopment Plan after holding a public hearing in compliance with the provisions of the Act; and
- d. The Planning Commission has reviewed the Redevelopment Plan, held a public hearing thereon and recommended its approval by the Mayor and Council of the City;
- e. The Agency has recommended approval of the Redevelopment Plan by the Mayor and Council of the City;
- f. The City, in compliance with all public notice requirements imposed by the Act, published and mailed notices of a public hearing regarding the consideration of the approval of the Redevelopment Plan pursuant to the Act, and has on the date of this Resolution held a public hearing on the proposal to approve the Redevelopment Plan and received extensive public comment thereon; and
- g. The City Council has reviewed the Redevelopment Plan and determined that the proposed land uses and building requirements described in it are designed with the general purpose of accomplishing a coordinated, adjusted, and harmonious development of the City and its environs which will, in accordance with present and future needs, promote health, safety, morals, order, convenience, prosperity, and the general welfare, as well as efficiency in economy in the process of development; including, among other things, adequate provision for traffic, vehicular parking, the promotion of safety from fire, panic, and other dangers, adequate provisions for light and air, the promotion of the healthful and convenient distribution of population, the provision of adequate transportation, water, sewerage, and other public utilities, schools, parks, recreational and community facilities, and other public requirements, the promotion of sound design and arrangement, the wise and efficient expenditure of public funds, and the prevention of the recurrence of unsanitary or unsafe dwelling accommodations, or conditions of blight.

Resolved that:

1. The Redevelopment Plan is determined to be feasible and in conformity with the general plan for the development of the City as a whole, and the Redevelopment Plan is in conformity with the legislative declarations and determinations set forth in the Act. Section 18-2102 of the Act establishes the legislative declarations and

determinations for the Act. The Redevelopment Plan clearly demonstrates that the criteria declarations have been satisfied. The Redevelopment Area (the "Site") constitutes an economically and socially undesirable land use in its current state. The Site contains numerous buildings and infrastructure in a state of deterioration and is not properly subdivided. The Site is not designed for proper utilization, is undesirable for economic and social purposes and constitutes a barrier to the sound growth of the City. Given the foregoing, the conditions of the Site are beyond the remedy and control of normal regulatory processes and police power and due to the high cost of development and cannot be dealt with effectively by the ordinary operations of private enterprise. Further documentation of these findings is set forth in Exhibit B.

The City Council acknowledges receipt of the recommendations of the Agency and the Planning Commission with respect to the Redevelopment Plan.

- 2. The Mayor and Clerk are authorized and directed to execute such documents and take such further actions as are necessary to carry out the purposes and intent of this Resolution and the Redevelopment Plan.
- 3. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.

PASSED and APPROVED on November 8, 2022.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-27 SIGNING OF THE YEAR-END CERTIFICATION OF CITY STREET SUPERINTENDENT 2022

WHEREAS: State of Nebraska Statutes, sections 39-2302, and 39-2511 through 39-2515 details the requirements that must be met in order for a municipality to qualify for an annual Incentive Payment; and

WHEREAS: The State of Nebraska Department of Transportation (NDOT) requires that each incorporated municipality must annually certify (by December 31st of each year) the appointment of the City Street Superintendent to the NDOT using the Year-End Certification of City Street Superintendent form; and

WHEREAS: The NDOT requires that such certification shall also include a copy of the documentation of the city street superintendent's appointment, i.e., meeting minutes; showing the appointment of the City Street Superintendent by their name as it appears on their License (if applicable), their License Number (if applicable), and Class of License (if applicable), and type of appointment, i.e. employed, contract (consultant, or interlocal agreement with another incorporated municipality and/or county), and the beginning date of the appointment; and

WHEREAS: The NDOT also requires that such Year-End Certification of City Street Superintendent form shall be signed by the Mayor and shall include a copy of a resolution of the governing body authorizing the signing of the Year-End Certification of City Street Superintendent form by the Mayor.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor of Lexington is hereby authorized to sign the attached Year-End Certification of City Street Superintendent form.

RESOLUTION: Resolution No. 2022-28 was presented for Council consideration. Pepplitsch reviewed proposed utility rate adjustments. Following discussion, moved by Vivas, seconded by Smith, to approve Resolution No. 2022-28 as presented. Roll call. Voting "aye" were Salem, Roberts, Smith, Vivas, Fagot. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022 - 28

WHEREAS, Lexington City Code Sections 28-232 and 28-439 authorizes the City Council to establish by Resolution a schedule of rates and charges for water service, and sanitary sewer service.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA, that the following rates and charges are established and shall take effect January 1, 2023, to be reflected on billings following such date. That all other electric rates, water rates, and sanitary sewer rates and charges previously established shall remain unchanged.

Section 1. Water Rates

Residential Metered: The first 5,000 gallons \$20.50 monthly minimum

> 5,000 gallons \$1.05 per 1,000 gallons

Residential Flat Rate: \$27.50 per dwelling unit per month

Commercial Metered: The first 5,000 gallons \$20.50 monthly minimum

> 5,000 gallons \$1.05 per 1,000 gallons

Multi-unit Service Fee: \$13.50 per dwelling/commercial unit, where more than one

dwelling/commercial unit is served by a single metered

service.

Industrial Metered: Base Charge per Month -- \$2,500

\$0.375 per 1,000 gallons metered use

Automated Meter Reading Fee: \$1.00 per month per metered or unmetered service.

Section 2. Sanitary Sewer Rates

Flat Rate Residential: \$27.00 per month.

Flat Rate Commercial: \$27.00 per month

Commercial Metered: \$2.70 per 1,000 gallons

\$27.00 minimum
