


RESOLUTION

WHEREAS it is frequently necessary for Medical Doctors to respond to emergency calls and to transport from and to their offices, special equipment needed on such calls and

WHEREAS the large number of cars parked on the streets, particularly during certain "shopping" hours and days, makes it virtually impossible for them to park vitally needed transportation within a reasonable walking distance from their offices during such hours and on such days

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Lexington that the City Manager and the Chief of Police be directed to provide a reasonable number of parking stalls reserved for the use of Medical Doctors during office hours; provided that such stalls shall be located outside the metered areas and shall be so selected as to inconvenience the general public as little as possible. Provided further that no such reservation shall be made in the name of any doctor but that all doctors are entitled to occupy any stall so reserved. The City Manager shall inform all doctors that reserved stalls are established in the public interest rather than as a personal privilege.
